**CONSENT AGREEMENT &  
 FINAL ORDER**

**I. STATUTORY AND REGULATORY AUTHORITY**

1. This Consent Agreement and Final Order ("CAFO") is entered into by Director of the Environmental Assessment and Innovation Division ("EAID"), United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"), Region III ("Complainant") and Stone Energy Corporation ("Respondent"), pursuant to Section 309(g) of the Clean Water Act ("CWA" or "Act"), 42 U.S.C. § 1319(g), and the *Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties, Issuance of Compliance or Corrective Action Orders, and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits*, 40 C.F.R. Part 22 (the "Consolidated Rules").
2. The authority to settle this matter is vested in the Administrator of the EPA. The Administrator has delegated this authority to the Regional Administrator for EPA

Region III, who in turn has delegated this authority to the Director of the Environmental Assessment and Innovation Division.

3. The parties have agreed to settlement of violations of the CWA by Respondent. This CAFO simultaneously commences and concludes this action pursuant to 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.13(b) and 22.18(b)(2) & (3).
4. Pursuant to Section 309(g) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), and the Civil Monetary Inflation Rule, 40 C.F.R. Part 19, any person violating the CWA is liable for an administrative penalty in an amount not to exceed \$16,000 per day for each day of the violation, up to a total penalty of \$177,500 for violations occurring between January 12, 2009 and December 6, 2013.

## **II. EPA'S FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

5. Respondent is a "person" within the meaning of Section 502(5) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(5).
6. At all times relevant to this CAFO, Respondent owned and/or operated the Maury Well Pad and the Weekley Well Pad, both described above (collectively, "the Sites"). In addition, Respondent owns the Mills-Wetzel Sites, located in the Lewis Wetzel Wildlife Management Area, which is not the subject of this CAFO. Violations at the Mills-Wetzel Sites were settled by Consent Order with the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection on March 31, 2014, under West Virginia Code, Chapter 22, Article 6, Order No. 2013-25.
7. The Weekley Well Pad is located 0.8 miles north of the intersection of West Virginia 20 and Ashland Ridge Road (County Road 40) near Porters Falls in Wetzel County, West Virginia and has its approximate center at Latitude 39° 35' 31" N and Longitude 80° 46' 41" W.
8. The Maury Well Pad is located approximately 0.75 miles northwest of the intersection of West Virginia Highway 7 and Turkey Run Road (County Road 38), 4 miles southeast of New Martinsville in Wetzel County, West Virginia and has its approximate center at Latitude 39° 37' 0.12" N and Longitude -80° 46' 58.44" W.
9. On January 9, 2013 EPA representatives inspected the Weekley Well Pad.
10. On June 20, 2012 EPA representatives inspected the Maury Well Pad.
11. These inspections resulted in the issuance of two administrative orders addressing CWA violations at the Sites:
  - a. EPA Docket No. CWA-03-2013-0118DW: issued March 29, 2013 for violations at the Weekley Well Pad;
  - b. EPA Docket No. CWA-03-2013-0005DW: issued November 9, 2012 for

violations at the Maury Well Pad.

12. Pursuant to the administrative orders cited in paragraph 11, Respondent submitted pre-disturbance site delineations which assessed the wetland and stream impacts at the Sites.
13. The submitted site delineation and EPA's inspection at the Weekley Well Pad confirmed that prior to construction the site contained an unnamed tributary ("UNT 1") of Fishing Creek, a relatively permanent water, which flowed approximately 750 linear feet to Fishing Creek.
14. Fishing creek flows 12.2 miles to the Ohio River and is formally identified by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) as a traditionally navigable water approximately 4.8 miles from the Weekley Well Pad, 7.4 miles above its mouth to the Ohio River.
15. UNT 1 constitutes a "water of the United States" within the meaning of Section 502(7) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(7); 40 C.F.R. § 232.2
16. The term "fill material" within the meaning of 40 C.F.R. § 232.2, includes any material which replaces portions of the "water of the United States" with dry land or which changes the bottom elevation of a water body.
17. On information and belief, Respondent and/or people acting on behalf of Respondent, operated equipment which discharged dredged and/or fill material to waters of the United States located at the Weekley Well Pad, resulting in the filling/relocation of approximately 680 linear feet of stream channel.
18. The submitted site delineation and EPA's inspection at the Maury Well Pad confirmed that prior to construction the site contained Duerrs Run, a relatively permanent water, and two unnamed tributaries to Duerrs Run ("UNT 2" & "UNT 3").
19. Duerrs Run flows to Little Fishing Creek which flows approximately 4.33 miles to Fishing Creek which flows approximately 5.76 miles to the Ohio River.
20. Fishing Creek is formally identified by the Corps as a traditionally navigable water approximately 4.33 miles from the Maury Well Pad, approximately 7.4 miles above its mouth to the Ohio River.
21. Duerrs Run, UNT 2, and UNT 3 constitute "waters of the United States" within the meaning of Section 502(7) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(7); 40 C.F.R. § 232.2.
22. On information and belief, Respondent and/or people acting on behalf of Respondent, operated equipment which discharged dredged and/or fill material to waters of the United States located at the Maury Well Pad resulting in the relocation, culverting, and/or disturbance (including rip-rapping) of approximately 421 linear feet of stream channel.

23. The equipment referenced in Paragraphs 17 and 22 constitutes a “point source” within the meaning of Section 502(14) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(14).
24. Section 301(a) of the Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1311(a) prohibits the discharge of dredged and/or fill material from a point source to waters of the United States except in compliance with a permit issued by the Secretary of the Army pursuant to Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344.
25. At no time during the discharge of dredged and/or fill material to the waters of the United States located on the Sites did Respondent have a permit from the Secretary of the Army as required by Section 404 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1344.
26. Respondent, by discharging dredged and/or fill material to the waters of the United States without authorization, has violated Section 301(a) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1311(a).

### **III. CONSENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER**

27. The parties agree that settlement of this matter prior to the initiation of litigation is in the public interest and that entry of this CAFO is the most appropriate means of resolving this matter.
28. For the purposes of this proceeding Respondent:
  - a. Admits the jurisdictional allegations contained in this consent agreement;
  - b. Neither admits nor denies the specific factual allegations contained in this consent agreement;
  - c. Consents to the assessment of any stated civil penalty, to the issuance of any specified compliance or corrective action, to any conditions specified in this consent agreement;
  - d. Waives the right to a hearing contesting the allegations contained herein and waives the right to appeal the final order accompanying this consent agreement.
29. Each party to this action shall bear its own costs and attorney’s fees.
30. Pursuant to Section 309(g)(4)(A) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(4)(A), EPA provided public notice and an opportunity to comment on this CAFO prior to issuing the Final Order. 40 C.F.R. § 22.45 requires a forty (40) day notice period in advance of an order which assesses a civil penalty.
31. Pursuant to Section 309(g)(1)(A) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(1)(A).

EPA consulted with the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection regarding this action and will mail a copy of this document to the appropriate West Virginia official.

32. Based on the foregoing FINDINGS OF FACT, and having taken into account the factors listed in Section 309(d) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(d), including but not limited to, the nature, circumstances, extent and gravity of the violation, the Respondent's knowledge, culpability and history of violations, the economic benefit to Respondent, the ability of Respondent to pay the penalty, Respondent's compliance with the Administrative Orders for Compliance referenced in Paragraph 11; the administrative record; and under the authority of Section 309(g)(2)(B) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. 1319(g)(2)(B), EPA HEREBY ORDERS AND RESPONDENT HEREBY CONSENTS to pay a civil penalty in the amount of one hundred and seventy-seven thousand, five hundred dollars (\$177,500) in full and final settlement of EPA's claims for civil penalties for the violations alleged herein.

#### **IV. PAYMENT TERMS**

33. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of \$177,500 for the violations alleged in this CAFO within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this CAFO pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.31(c), in the following manner:

**V. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

34. This CAFO shall not relieve Respondent of its obligation to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state or local law and ordinance, nor shall it be construed to be a ruling on, or determination of, any issue related to any federal, state or local permit. Nor does this CAFO constitute a waiver, suspension or modification of the requirements of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. §§ 1251, *et seq.*, or any regulations promulgated thereunder.
35. This CAFO is conditioned upon the accuracy of the Respondent's representations to EPA, including but not limited to Respondents' intent to comply with Administrative Orders for Compliance referenced in Paragraph 11. EPA reserves the right to institute a new and/or separate action should Respondents fail to comply with the terms of this CAFO or the Administrative Orders for Compliance referenced in Paragraph 11. That right shall be in addition to all other rights and causes of action, civil or criminal, the EPA may have under law or equity in such event.
36. The following notice concerns interest and late penalty charges that will accrue in the event that any portion of the civil penalty is not paid as directed:
- a. Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717 and 40 C.F.R. § 13.11, EPA is entitled to assess interest and late payment penalties on outstanding debts owed to the United States and a charge to cover the costs of processing and handling a delinquent claim, as more fully described below. Accordingly, Respondent's failure to make timely payment or to comply with the conditions in this CAFO shall result in the assessment of late payment charges including interest, penalties, and/or administrative costs of handling delinquent debts.

- b. Interest on the civil penalty assessed in this CAFO will begin to accrue on the date that a copy of this CAFO is mailed or hand-delivered to Respondent. However, EPA will not seek to recover interest on any amount of the civil penalty that is paid within thirty (30) calendar days after the date on which such interest begins to accrue. Interest will be assessed at the rate of the United States Treasury tax and loan rate in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 13.11(a).
  - c. The costs of the Agency's administrative handling of overdue debts will be charged and assessed monthly throughout the period the debt is overdue. 40 C.F.R. § 13.11(b). A penalty charge not to exceed six percent per year will be assessed monthly on any portion of the civil penalty which remains delinquent for more than ninety (90) calendar days. 40 C.F.R. § 13.11(c). Should assessment of the penalty charge on the debt be required, it shall accrue from the first day payment is delinquent. 31 C.F.R. § 901.9(d).
37. This Consent Agreement and the accompanying Final Order resolve only the civil claims for the specific violations alleged herein. EPA reserves the right to commence action against any person, including Respondent, in response to any condition which EPA determines may present an imminent and substantial endangerment to the public health, public welfare, or the environment. In addition, this settlement is subject to all limitations on the scope of resolution and to the reservation of rights set forth in Section 22.18(c) of the Consolidated Rules. Further, EPA reserves any rights and remedies available to it under the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. §§ 301 *et seq.*, the regulations promulgated thereunder, and any other federal laws or regulations for which EPA has jurisdiction, to enforce the provisions of this CAFO, following its filing with the Regional Hearing Clerk. Respondent reserves all rights and defenses it may have to defend itself in any such action.
38. Nothing in this CAFO shall be construed as prohibiting, altering or in any way eliminating the ability of EPA to seek any other remedies or sanctions available by virtue of Respondent's violations of this CAFO or of the statutes and regulations upon which this CAFO is based or for Respondent's violation of any applicable provision of law.
39. The penalty specified above represents civil penalties assessed by EPA and shall not be deductible for purposes of Federal taxes.
40. EPA shall have the right to institute a new and separate action to recover additional civil penalties for the claims made in this CAFO if the EPA obtains evidence that the information and/or representations of the Respondent is false, or, in any material respect, inaccurate. This right shall be in addition to all other rights and causes of action, civil or criminal, the EPA may have under law or equity in such event.
41. The undersigned representative of Respondent certifies that he or she is fully authorized by the party represented to enter into the terms and conditions of this CAFO and to execute and legally bind that party to it.




42. All of the terms and conditions of this CAFO together comprise one agreement, and each of the terms and conditions is in consideration of all of the other terms and conditions. In the event that this CAFO, or one or more of its terms and conditions, is held invalid, or is not executed by all of the signatories in identical form, or is not approved in such identical form by the Regional Administrator or his designee, then the entire CAFO shall be null and void.

**VI. PUBLIC NOTICE AND EFFECTIVE DATE**

43. Pursuant to 33 U.S.C. § 309(g)(4) and 40 C.F.R. § 22.45, this CAFO issued after the conclusion of a forty(40) day public notice period concluded. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.45(c)(3), this CAFO will not be issued until ten (10) days after the close of the public comment notice period. This CAFO will become final and effective thirty (30) days after issuance, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(5).


