	Preliminary Statement	REGION 5		

- 1. Complainant, the Director of the Land and Chemicals Division, United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region 5, brought this administrative action seeking a civil penalty under Section 16(a) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a).
- 2. On May 10, 2010, EPA filed the Complaint in this action against Respondent Wade Taatjes, a/k/a Dennis Wade Taatjes. The Complaint alleges that Respondent violated Section 1018(b)(5) of the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992, 42 U.S.C. § 4852d(b)(5); Section 409 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2689; and 40 C.F.R. §§ 745.113(a)(1)-(5), 745.113(a)(7), and 745.113(b)(3), (b)(4), and (b)(6), in two contracts to sell target housing and two contracts to lease target housing.
 - 3. Respondent filed an Answer and requested a hearing in this matter.

Stipulations

- 4. Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations in the Complaint and neither admits nor denies the factual allegations in the Complaint.
- 5. Respondent waives any right to contest the allegations in the Complaint and his right to appeal this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO).
- 6. Respondent certifies that he is fully complying with the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 and the regulations at 40 C.F.R. Part 745.
- 7. Respondent consents to the assessment of the civil penalty stated in this CAFO and to the terms of this CAFO.
- 8. The parties agree that settling this action without further litigation, upon the terms of this CAFO, is in the public interest.

Civil Penalties

- 9. In consideration of Respondent's good-faith, cooperation, litigation costs, and other mitigating factors, EPA agrees to mitigate the proposed penalty of \$8,768 to \$3,000.
- 10. Respondent must pay a \$3,000 civil penalty with interest in eight installments, as follows:

- 12. This civil penalty is not deductible for federal tax purposes.
- 13. If Respondent does not pay any installment payment as set forth in paragraph 10, above, the entire unpaid balance of the civil penalty, shall become due and owing upon written notice by EPA to Respondent of the delinquency. EPA may refer this matter to the Attorney General who will recover such amount, plus interest, in the appropriate district court of the United States under Section 16(a) of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a). The validity, amount, and appropriateness of the civil penalty are not reviewable in a collection action.
- 14. Pursuant to 31 C.F.R. § 901.9, Respondent must pay the following on any amount overdue under this CAFO. Interest will accrue on any amount overdue from the date payment was due at a rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury. Respondent must pay a \$15 handling charge each month that any portion of the penalty is more than 30 days past due. In addition, Respondent must pay a 6 percent per year penalty on any principal amount 90 days past due.

General Provisions

- 15. This CAFO resolves only Respondent's liability for federal civil penalties for the violations alleged in the Complaint.
- 16. This CAFO does not affect the right of EPA or the United States to pursue appropriate injunctive or other equitable relief or criminal sanctions for any violation of law.
- 17. This CAFO does not affect Respondent's responsibility to comply with the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 and other applicable federal, state, and local laws.
 - 18. The terms of this CAFO bind Respondent, and his successors and assigns.
- 19. Each person signing this agreement certifies that he or she has the authority to sign for the party whom he or she represents and to bind that party to its terms.
 - 20. Each party agrees to bear its own costs and attorney's fees in this action.
 - 21. This CAFO constitutes the entire agreement between the parties.
