## **Consent Agreement and Final Order**

- 1. The Complainant is, by lawful delegation, the Chief of the Emergency Response Branch 1, United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA), Region 5.
- 2. On July 9, 2008, U.S. EPA filed the Complaint in this action against Respondent Duke Energy Indiana. The Complaint alleges that Respondent violated Section 103(a) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), 42 U.S.C. § 9603(a), by failing to immediately notify the National Response Center of a release which occurred at its facility in Cayuga, Indiana on June 14, 2005; and violated Section 304(a) of Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), 42 U.S.C. § 11004(a), by failing to immediately notify the Indiana State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) of the June 14, 2005 release and by failing to immediately notify the community emergency coordinator for the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) for an area likely to be affected by the release.

3. Respondent filed an Answer and requested a hearing under Section 325(b)(1)(B) of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11045(b)(1)(B), and Section 109(a)(2)(B) of CERCLA, 42 U.S.C. § 9609(a)(2)(B).

### **Stipulations**

- 4. Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations in the Complaint and neither admits nor denies the factual allegations in the Complaint other than those it admitted in its Answer.
- 5. Respondent waives any right to contest the allegations in the Complaint and its right to appeal this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO).
  - 6. The parties consent to the terms of this CAFO.
- 7. The parties agree that settling this action without further litigation, upon the terms in this CAFO, is in the public interest.

## **Civil Penalty**

- 8. In consideration of Respondent's responsiveness and its provision of supporting documentation requested, and Respondent's cooperation and preparedness during the settlement process, Complainant has determined that an appropriate civil penalty to settle this action is \$54,402.
- 9. Within 30 days after the effective date of this CAFO, Respondent must pay a \$18,134 civil penalty for the CERCLA violation. Respondent must pay the penalty by sending a cashier's or certified check, payable to "EPA Hazardous Substance Superfund," to:

10. Within 30 days after the effective date of this CAFO, Respondent must pay a \$36,268 civil penalty for the EPCRA violations. Respondent must pay the penalty by sending a cashier's or certified check, payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America," to:

11. A transmittal letter, stating Respondent's name, the case title, Respondent's complete address, the case docket number and the billing document number must accompany the payments. Respondent must send a copy of the checks and transmittal letters to:

12. This civil penalty is not deductible for federal tax purposes.

- 13. If Respondent does not timely pay the civil penalty, U.S. EPA may bring an action to collect any unpaid portion of the penalty with interest, handling charges, nonpayment penalties and the United States' enforcement expenses for the collection action. The validity, amount and appropriateness of the civil penalty are not reviewable in a collection action.
- 14. Pursuant to 31 C.F.R. § 901.9, Respondent must pay the following on any amount overdue under this CAFO. Interest will accrue on any amount overdue from the date the payment was due at a rate established pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717. Respondent must pay a \$15 handling charge each month that any portion of the penalty is more than 30 days past due. In addition, U.S. EPA will assess a 6 percent per year penalty on any principal amount 90 days past due.

### **General Provisions**

- 15. This CAFO resolves only Respondent's liability for federal civil penalties for the violations alleged in the Complaint and summarized in the CAFO.
- 16. This CAFO does not affect the right of the U.S. EPA or the United States to pursue appropriate injunctive or other equitable relief or criminal sanctions for any violations of law.
- 17. Respondent certifies that it is complying with Section 103(a) of CERCLA,42 U.S.C. § 9603(a), and Section 304 of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11004.
- 18. This CAFO does not affect Respondent's responsibility to comply with CERCLA, EPCRA and other applicable federal, state and local laws, and regulations.
- 19. This CAFO is a "final order" for purposes of U.S. EPA's Enforcement Response Policy for Section 103 of CERCLA.
- 20. The terms of this CAFO bind the Complainant, the U.S. EPA, and the Respondent and its successors, and assigns.

- 21. Each person signing this consent agreement certifies that he or she has the authority to sign for the party whom he or she represents and to bind that party to its terms.
- 22. Each party agrees to bear its own costs and fees, including attorneys' fees, in this action.
  - 23. This CAFO constitutes the entire agreement between the parties.
