Preliminary Statement

- 1. Complainant, the Director of the Land and Chemicals Division, United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 5, brought this administrative action seeking a civil penalty under Section 14(a) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), 7 U.S.C. § 136*l*(a).
- 2. On December 22, 2012, EPA filed the Complaint in this action against Respondent, Nestle Purina PetCare Company. The Complaint alleges that Respondent violated Section 12(a)(1)(A) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A), by distributing or selling an unregistered pesticide product.
- 3. Respondent filed an Answer and requested a hearing under Section 14 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136*l*, and 40 C.F.R. § 22.15.

Stipulations

- 4. Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations in the Complaint and neither admits nor denies the factual allegations in the Complaint, other than those admitted in its Answer.
 - 5. Respondent waives any right to contest the allegations in the Complaint and its right

to appeal this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO).

- 6. Respondent certifies that it is complying fully with FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. §§ 136-136y.
- 7. Respondent consents to the assessment of the civil penalty specified in this CAFO and to the terms of this CAFO.
- 8. The parties agree that settling this action without further litigation, upon the terms of this CAFO, is in the public interest.

Civil Penalty

- 9. In consideration of Respondent's cooperation and good faith efforts to compy with FIFRA the Complainant agrees to mitigate the proposed penalty of \$721,200 to \$395,000, to be paid in two installments.
- 10. Within 30 days after the effective date of this CAFO, Respondent shall pay a first installment of one hundred and thirty five thousand dollars (\$135,000). Respondent shall make a second payment of two hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$260,000) plus interest on or before January 11, 2013, or one hundred eighty (180) days after the filing of this CAFO, whichever is the later. Interest on the second installment is calculated at one percent (1%) and will be seven dollars and 22 cents (\$7.22) per day from the time of filing of this CAFO.
- 11. Respondent must pay the installments by electronic funds transfer, payable to "Treasurer, United States of America," and sent to:

12. Respondent must send a notice of payment that states Respondent's name, complete address, the case docket number and the billing document number to EPA at the following addresses when it pays the penalty:

- 13. This civil penalty is not deductible for federal tax purposes.
- 14. If Respondent does not pay any installment payment as set forth in paragraph 10 above, the entire balance of the civil penalties plus any amount due under paragraph 15 below shall become due and owing upon written notice by EPA to Respondent of the delinquency. EPA may refer the delinquency to the Attorney General to recover any unpaid penalty with interest by action in the appropriate United States district court under Section 14(a)(5) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136*l*(a)(5). The validity, amount and appropriateness of the civil penalty are not reviewable in a collection action.
- 15. Pursuant to 31 C.F.R. § 901.9, Respondent must pay the following on any amount overdue under this CAFO. Interest will accrue on any overdue amount from the date payment was due at a rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury. Such interest shall be in addition

to the interest calculated pursuant to paragraph 10. Respondent must pay a \$15 handling charge each month that any portion of the penalty is more than 30 days past due. In addition, Respondent must pay a 6 percent per year penalty on any principal amount 90 days past due.

General Provisions

- 16. This CAFO resolves only Respondent's liability for federal civil penalties for the violations alleged in the Complaint.
- 17. This CAFO does not affect the rights of EPA or the United States to pursue appropriate injunctive or other equitable relief or criminal sanctions for any violation of law.
- 18. This CAFO does not affect Respondent's responsibility to comply with FIFRA and other applicable federal, state and local laws.
- 19. This CAFO is a "final order" for purposes of EPA's FIFRA Enforcement Response Policy.
 - 20. The terms of this CAFO bind Respondent, its successors and assigns.
- 21. Each person signing this agreement certifies that he or she has the authority to sign for the party whom he or she represents and to bind that party to its terms.
 - 22. Each party agrees to bear its own costs and attorneys fees in this action.
 - 23. This CAFO constitutes the entire agreement between the parties.
