Preliminary Statement

REGIONAL HEARING CLERK U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

- 1. Complainant, the Director of the Land and Chemicals Division, United States
 Environmental Protection Agency, Region 5, brought this administrative action seeking a civil
 penalty under Section 16(a) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a).
- 2. On January 7, 2009, EPA filed the Complaint in this action against Respondents Thomas A. Nowakowski, Brian T. Nowakowski, Michael Moore, and Apple Apartments, Inc. The Complaint alleges that Respondents violated Section 1018(b)(5) of the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992, 42 U.S.C. § 4852d(b)(5); Section 409 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2689; and 40 C.F.R. § 745.113(a)(1), (2), (3), (4), and (7), in one contract to sell target housing by Respondent Thomas A. Nowakowski, and 40 C.F.R. § 745.113(b)(1), (2), (3), (4), and (6) in three contracts to lease target housing by Respondents Brian T. Nowakowski, Michael Moore, and Apple Apartments, Inc..

Stipulations

3. Respondents admit the jurisdictional allegations in the Complaint and neither admit nor deny the factual allegations in the Complaint.

- 4. Respondents waive any right to contest the allegations in the Complaint and their right to appeal this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO).
- 5. Respondents certify that they are complying fully with the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 and the regulations at 40 C.F.R. Part 745.
- 6. Respondents consent to the assessment of the civil penalty stated in this CAFO and to the terms of this CAFO.
- 7. The parties agree that settling this action without further litigation, upon the terms of this CAFO, is in the public interest.

Civil Penalties

- 8. In consideration of Respondents' cooperation in settling this matter, EPA agrees to mitigate the proposed penalty of \$11,920 to \$8,344.
- 9. Within 30 days after the effective date of this CAFO, Respondents must pay the \$8,344 civil penalty by sending a cashier's or certified check, by regular U.S. Postal Service mail, payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America," to:

The check must state In the matter of Thomas A. Nowakowski, Brian T. Nowakowski, Michael Moore, and Apple Apartments, Inc., the docket number of this CAFO, and the billing document number.

10. A transmittal letter stating Respondents' names, complete address, the case docket number, and the billing document number must accompany the payment. Respondents must send a copy of the check and transmittal letter to:

- 11. This civil penalty is not deductible for federal tax purposes.
- 12. If Respondents do not pay the civil penalty timely, or any stipulated penalties due under paragraph 14, below, EPA may refer this matter to the Attorney General who will recover such amount, plus interest, in the appropriate district court of the United States under Section 16(a) of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a). The validity, amount, and appropriateness of the civil penalty are not reviewable in a collection action.
- 13. Pursuant to 31 C.F.R. § 901.9, Respondents must pay the following on any amount overdue under this CAFO. Interest will accrue on any amount overdue from the date payment was due at a rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury. Respondents must pay a \$15 handling charge each month that any portion of the penalty is more than 30 days past due. In addition, Respondents must pay a 6 percent per year penalty on any principal amount 90 days past due.

General Provisions

14. This CAFO resolves only Respondents' liability for federal civil penalties for the violations alleged in the Complaint.

15. This CAFO does not affect the right of EPA or the United States to pursue appropriate injunctive or other equitable relief or criminal sanctions for any violation of law.

16. This CAFO does not affect Respondents' responsibility to comply with the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 and other applicable federal, state, and local laws.

17. The terms of this CAFO bind Respondents, and their successors and assigns.

18. Each person signing this agreement certifies that he or she has the authority to sign for the party whom he or she represents and to bind that party to its terms.

19. Each party agrees to bear its own costs and attorney's fees in this action.

20. This CAFO constitutes and entire agreement between the parties.
