



EPA to Review Cleanup Progress at Queen City Farms Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is doing a Five-Year Review of the Queen City Farms Superfund site on Cedar Grove Road in Maple Valley, Washington. The review is a checkup to make sure the barrier wall at the site continues to operate as planned, and that people and the environment remain protected.

Background: Local industries disposed of industrial waste at Queen City Farms, which contained volatile organic compounds, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) and metals. EPA listed the site on the National Priorities List, which is a list of the nation's most contaminated hazardous waste sites.
