Re: NOTICE OF FUNDS AVAILABLE FY10 - Clean Water Act Section 106 Tribal Program

The Clean Water Act (CWA) authorizes the Environmental Protection Agency to provide financial assistance for water quality planning and management to Indian Tribes under Section 106, Water Pollution Control and Groundwater Management Programs. This letter provides notice of FY10 funds being made available to eligible Tribal governments in Region 10. We are sending the application information separately to your Tribal water quality (or environmental program) staff to apply for these funds.

Tribal funding targets are attached to this letter for your information. EPA provides 95% of the funding for the program award, with a 5% Tribal match needed to support the total project cost. Although EPA presently does not have an annual operating budget, we anticipate available funding will be about the same level as last year.

Draft work plan proposals are due no later than **Friday January 29, 2010**. The work plans can be submitted electronically to the EPA Project Officer. The CWA 106 awards are subject to past performance evaluations, and this will be factored into the Project Officer's pre-award review of the submitted project proposals. Being provided a "target" figure for funding does not ensure that an award will be made.
