The United States Environmental Protection Agency Region 8 (EPA), by its undersigned representatives, and Langston Concrete, Inc. (Respondent) hereby consent and agree as follows:

- On May 30, 2013, the EPA issued a Complaint and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (Complaint) alleging that the Respondent violated a general permit authorizing discharges of stormwater associated with construction activities. The Complaint proposed that the Respondent pay an administrative civil penalty for the alleged violations, pursuant to section 309(g)(2)(A) of the Clean Water Act (Act), 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(2)(A).
- The Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations of the Complaint and neither admits
 nor denies the specific factual allegations of the Complaint. The Respondent does not admit to any
 violations of the Act or to any wrongdoing.
- The Respondent waives its rights to contest the allegations in the Complaint and to appeal
 the Final Order issued by the Regional Judicial Officer approving this Consent Agreement.
- 4. This Consent Agreement, upon incorporation into a Final Order, applies to and is binding upon the EPA and upon the Respondent and the Respondent's successors and assigns. Any change in the Respondent's ownership and/or operation, including, but not limited to, any transfer of assets or real or personal property, shall not alter the Respondent's responsibilities under this Consent Agreement.
 This Consent Agreement contains all terms of the settlement agreed to by the parties.

- 5. The Respondent consents and agrees to pay a civil penalty in the amount of five thousand and five hundred dollars (\$5,500.00) in the manner described below:
 - a. Payment shall be in a single payment of \$5,550.00, due no later than 30 calendar days, from the date of the Final Order issued by the Regional Judicial Officer, that adopts this Consent Agreement. If the due date for the payment falls on a weekend or federal holiday, then the due date is the next business day. The date a payment is made is considered to be the date processed by the U.S. Bank, as described below. Payment must be received by 11:00 AM Eastern Standard Time to be considered as received that day.
 - b. The payment shall be made by remitting a cashier's or certified check or making a wire transfer or on-line payment. The check or other payment shall designate the name and docket number of this case, be in the amount stated in part "a," above, and be payable to "Treasurer, United States of America." The payment shall be sent as follows:

- c. If a payment is not received by the specified due date, interest accrues from the date of the Final Order, not the due date, at a rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717, and will continue to accrue until payment in full is received (e.g., on the 1st late day, 30 days of interest will have accrued).
- d. In addition, a handling charge of fifteen dollars (\$15) shall be assessed the 31st day from the date of the Final Order, and for each subsequent 30-day period that the debt, or any portion thereof, remains unpaid. In addition, a 6% per annum penalty shall be assessed on any unpaid principal amount if payment is not received within 30 days of the due date. Payments are first applied to outstanding handling charges, 6% penalty interest, and late interest. The remainder is then applied to the outstanding principal amount.
- The Respondent agrees that the penalty shall never be claimed as a federal or other tax deduction or credit.
- Nothing in this Consent Agreement shall relieve the Respondent of the duty to comply
 with the Act, its implementing regulations, or any permits issued pursuant to the Act.
- 7. Any failure by the Respondent to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Agreement shall constitute a breach of this Consent Agreement and may result in referral of the matter to the Department of Justice for enforcement of this Consent Agreement and for such other relief as may be appropriate.
- 8. Nothing in this Consent Agreement shall be construed as a waiver by the EPA or any other federal entity of its authority to seek costs or any appropriate penalty associated with any

collection action instituted as a result of any failure by the Respondent to meet its obligations under this Consent Agreement.

- The parties agree to submit this Consent Agreement to the Regional Judicial Officer, with a request that it be incorporated into a Final Order.
 - 10. Each party shall bear its own costs and attorney's fees in this matter.
- 11. This Consent Agreement, upon incorporation into a Final Order by the Regional Judicial Officer and full satisfaction by the parties, shall be a full settlement of the United States' claims for civil penalties against the Respondent for the specific violations alleged in the Complaint.
- 12. The undersigned representative of the Respondent certifies that he is fully authorized to enter into this Consent Agreement and to bind the Respondent to the terms of this Consent Agreement.
