COMPLAINANT'S BRIEF PURSUANT TO ORDER ELECTING TO REVIEW SUA SPONTE

Now Comes the Complainant, the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") Region 2, by and through the undersigned counsel, and respectfully submits Complainant's Brief in compliance with the Environmental Appeals Board ("EAB" or "Board") November 14, 2008, Order Electing to Review Sua Sponte, the Default Order and Initial Decision issued by the Regional Judicial Officer Helen S. Ferrara ("Presiding Officer") in the above matter.

I. PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

On November 14, 2008, the Board, pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.30(b), elected to review one specific component of the Default Order and Initial Decision ("Default Order") issued by the Presiding Officer in the above matter. The Board noted that

the Presiding Officer had provided a detailed analysis of the facts of the case, including service of the complaint and motion for default but found that the question of whether Las Delicias is an unincorporated community subject to suit under a common name required further review. The Board noted that the Presiding Judge in the Default Order had failed to address these predicates to the applicability of 40 C.F.R. § 22.5(b)(1)(ii)(A).

II. FACTUAL BACKGROUND

On July 11, 2003, the Region issued to Las Delicias

Community ("Respondent") a Complaint, Findings of Violation,

Notice of Proposed Assessment of a Civil Penalty, and Notice of

Opportunity to Request a Hearing, Docket No. SDWA-02-2003-8265

("Complaint") pursuant to the provisions of the Safe Drinking

Water Act ("SDWA") assessing a civil penalty of \$500. The

Complaint alleged that Las Delicias Community had failed to

comply with the provisions of the SDWA and the Surface Water

Treatment Rule ("SWTR"), 40 C.F.R. Part 141, Subpart H, National

Primary Drinking Water Regulations.

Las Delicias Community owns and/or operates a public water system (known as Las Delicias Public Water System) located in State Road 533, in the Municipality of Ciales, Puerto Rico. As owner/operator of the public water system, Las Delicias Community is a "supplier of water" within the meaning of Section 1401 of the SDWA, 42 U.S.C. § 300-f (4) and (5), which states:

"...(4)(A) In general.-the term 'public water system'

means a system for the provision to the public of water for human consumption through pipes or other constructed conveyances, if such system has as least fifteen connections or regularly serves at least twenty-five individuals...

•••

(5) The term 'supplier of water' means any person who owns or operates a public water system."

Under 40 C.F.R. § 141.2, a "community water system" means a public water system which serves at least fifteen service connections used by year-round residents or regularly serves at least twenty-five year-round residents.

Pursuant to Section 1401(12) and (13) (A) of the SDWA,
42 U.S.C. §300f-(12) and 13(A), and 40 C.F.R. §141.2, a "person"
is defined, among others, as an individual, corporation or
association.

Throughout the years, and at least since 1999, a group of people, of approximately 48 individuals, who make up Las Delicias Community, take their water from the community public water system, which, during the time in question and up to the present, they operate. The community group has maintained open communication with Region 2 representatives throughout the years. The enforcement officer handling this case is Ms. Cristina Maldonado, who holds the position of Environmental Scientist, in EPA's Caribbean Environmental Protection Division, Municipal water Branch, in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Ms. Maldonado has followed up in her compliance assistance efforts with the

community and to the best of her knowledge the people who make up the Las Delicias Community, and who operate the community public water system, are not incorporated and the group is known by the common name of "Las Delicias Community". See Exhibit 1, Declaration of Cristina I. Maldonado, in Support of Complainant's Brief to Order Electing to Review Sua Sponte, with attachments.

III. DISCUSSION OF ISSUE SUBJECT TO REVIEW SUA SPONTE

Whether Las Delicias Community Is An Unincorporated

Association Subject To Suit Under A Common Name

As discussed above, Las Delicias Community is the "common name" used by the group of individuals who operate a community public water system in a rural area of the Municipality of Ciales, Puerto Rico, also known as the "Las Delicias Community Public Water System." EPA's record reveals that the small community group is not incorporated under the laws of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico¹.

For the following reasons, those individuals that go under the common name of Las Delicias Community, are subject as such to suit under applicable law, in this case, the SDWA and its implementing regulations, set forth at 40 C.F.R. Part 141, Subpart H, as required by 40 C.F.R. § 22.5(b)(1)(ii)(A) of the Consolidated Rules of Practice ("CROP").

First, as noted above, the SDWA defines a "person" as, among

others, an individual, corporation or association. See SDWA Section 1401(12), 42 U.S.C. §300f-(12). Under Section 1414(g)(3)(B) of the SDWA, 42 U.S.C. §300g-3(g)(3)(B) (which is the section pursuant to which EPA brought the action in this matter), an administrative or judicial enforcement action may be initiated against "any person."

Second, the CROP addresses filing, service and form of all filed documents and business confidentiality matters. As to service of the complaint, it requires that complainant serve on "...respondent, or a representative authorized to receive service..." Where the respondent is an "unincorporated association which is subject to suit under a common name" service may be to a person authorized by appointment or by Federal or State law to receive service of process. Section 22.5(b)(1)(ii)(A).

Under the CROP, a "respondent" is the person against whom an administrative complaint is issued, see 40 CFR § 22.3 (definition of "Respondent"), and may be considered the equivalent of a "defendant" in a judicial trial. The CROP defines a "person" as:

"any individual, partnership, association, corporation, and any trustee, assignee, receiver or legal successor thereof; any organized group of persons whether incorporated or not; and any officer, employee, agent, department, agency or instrumentality of the Federal Government, of any State or local unit of government, or of any foreign government." Section 22.3(a) of the CROP (Emphasis provided)

community and provide information that the community is not incorporated.

There is no question as to whether the group can be named a respondent in an administrative case which follows the CROP because it is an organized group of unincorporated persons. Las Delicias, as we have discussed above, consists of a rural community of approximately 48 individuals, who take their water from a community public water system under their control. This group has several things in common, they live in the same rural area and they all receive their water from the same public water supply which bears the community's common name: "Las Delicias".

The question now is whether we can name the respondent under its common name, and if so, whom shall we serve notice on under the CROP.

The CROP requires that complainant shall notice of all documents on "...respondent, or a representative authorized to receive service..." Where the respondent is an "unincorporated association which is subject to suit under a common name" service may be to a person authorized by appointment or by Federal or State law to receive service of process. Section 22.5(b)(1)(ii)(A).

Rule 4.4 of the Rules of Civil Procedure of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico ("RCP PR"), 32 L.P.R.A. Ap. III R.4.4, describes the process for personal service of a civil action. Under Rule 4.4(3), for a corporation, company, partnership, association or any other artificial person, service shall be done by delivering

a copy of the summons and the complaint to an "officer, managing or general agent, or to any other agent authorized by appointment or designated by law to receive service of process." Rule 15.3. of the RCP PR, Defendants under a common name-, states:

"Whenever two (2) or more persons do business under a common name, regardless of whether or not said name contains the names of said persons, they may be sued under the common name and service upon one of them shall be sufficient."

32 L.P.R.A. Ap. III R 15.3

In the present case, Las Delicias Community is subject to suit under its common name, and service was duly performed to a person authorized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

In order to understand how this name came about, we have to briefly discuss the community water systems in Puerto Rico.

We can safely argue that it is common knowledge, that one of the most important health issues countries still face, even in the 21st century, is adequate drinking water supply for rural communities and developing countries.

Las Delicias Community Public Water System is one of approximately 250-280 public water systems or as they are commonly referred to, "Non-PRASA systems" in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. These communities, which are not hooked up to PRASA filtration systems, derive their drinking water from surface sources like ponds, creeks and rivers, and could be exposed to

waterborne diseases due to lack of proper water disinfection.

Since 1999, EPA has tried to bring Las Delicias Community into compliance with the SWTR. However, as the record shows, they have constantly failed to comply with the filtration requirements specified in 40 C.F.R. Part 141 Subpart H. EPA's main concern is the risk to the users of the system to Giardia lamblia and waterborne diseases and pathogens. As the Presiding Officer mentions in her Order, Respondent's failure to comply with the SDWA (failing to comply with the filtration and disinfection requirements) has subjected a population of approximately 48 individuals to serious health risks over a significant time.

IV. CONCLUSION

Complainant hereby submits its Brief in response to the Board's Order to Review Sua Sponte. Complainant has fully addressed the specific issue subject to the Board's review and respectfully requests that the Board confirm the Presiding Officer's Decision in the above case.

On May 6, 1999, I visited the Acued. Las Delicias system to follow-up on the community efforts to comply with AO-287F, which expired on June 30, 1997. I talked to Mrs. Iris N. Reyes Torres, the person in charge of the system.

The community is not organized and it's not incorporated. The aqueduct draws water from a creek, has no distribution tank and applies no treatment at all. It serves some 12 households.

The Cialitos PRASA system (4" pipe) runs through state road 149 up to km. 34.5, at the intersection with road 533. This PRASA system is in the immediate vicinity of Las Delicias community. Since this is a relatively small community there is a great likelihood that PRASA can serve them all. This community should be included in the SEP being worked out to connect Non-PRASA systems to PRASA.


