

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STATUS REPORT ON MEDIATION AND PERMIT MODIFICATION PROCEEDINGS

The United States Environmental Protection Agency, New England Region ("Region") respectfully submits this status report to the Environmental Appeals Board ("Board") with respect to the above-captioned matter.

The Region indicated in its last Status Report, filed December 27, 2005, that it had delayed issuance of a draft permit modification of NPDES Permit No. MA0100480 ("Permit") to the City of Marlborough ("Marlborough") in light of efforts initiated by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP") to resolve the dispute through settlement.

The Region has since learned that Marlborough has entered into preliminary discussions with the Town of Northborough ("Northborough") to redirect Northborough's flow from the Marlborough Westerly Wastewater Treatment Facility ("Westerly Facility") to a suitable groundwater discharge site. The Westerly Facility currently treats sewage from Northborough pursuant to an inter-municipal agreement. Redirecting Northborough's flow to groundwater would free additional flow capacity for Marlborough's use. Marlborough views such flow capacity as a critical factor in accommodating economic growth in the city. An agreement with Northborough along the lines described above would obviate the need for a flow increase in the Permit, the Region's denial of which Marlborough has challenged in its appeal to the EAB. See Marlborough Petition for Review at p.11. Such an agreement would also address concerns recently articulated by the Organization for the Assabet River regarding the

impact of flow increases on the Assabet River, which is already heavily dominated by wastewater effluent under critical low flow conditions.

Officials from Marlborough and Northborough are scheduled to meet on Thursday, January 19, 2006 to discuss the proposal. The Acting Assistant Commissioner of DEP's Bureau of Resource Protection has informed the Region that Marlborough will withdraw its petition for review if Marlborough receives "clear signals" that the flow issue can be resolved through a settlement with Northborough. A flow agreement between the two municipalities has the potential to resolve the outstanding EAB appeals and, consequently, to clear the way for initiation of the planned major upgrade of the Westerly Facility, a predicate to restoration of designated uses in the Assabet River. In consultation with DEP, the Region has, accordingly, decided to await the outcome of the meeting between the two municipalities before proceeding with the partial withdrawal and modification of the permit.

The Region appreciates that the Board's November 22, 2005 Order Staying Proceedings until May 8, 2006 was based on an assumption that the Region would meet certain interim milestones in the permit modification process and would issue the final modification on or around April 1, 2006. The Region reiterates that it will make best efforts to ensure that the modification process is completed as close to the original deadline as possible should the matter not be resolved outside of litigation.
