Re: Freedom of Information Act Appeal 04-RIN-00024-07-A (APP-00015-07)

Dear Mr. Wilson:

I am responding to your November 20, 2006 Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") appeal. You appealed the November 3, 2006 decision of Russell L. Wright, Jr. ("decision") of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA" or "Agency") to deny in part the request you submitted to EPA on October 5, 2006. Your request sought documents pertaining to the EPA's case file relating to an Agency enforcement action that was pending against you at the time. The decision stated that your request was denied in part because the documents were exempt from disclosure under Exemptions 5, and 7(a) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. §§ 552 (b)(5), (b)(7)(a). The decision included a numbered document list citing these exemptions that I will reference within this appeal decision.

I have carefully considered your request, EPA's decision, and your appeal. For the reasons set forth below, I have determined that your appeal should be, and is, granted in part and denied in part. Portions of documents 1, 2, 4c, 7, 8 and 9 have been released, while other portions have been withheld as indicated on the copies enclosed. Documents 3, 4a, 4b, 5, 6 and 10 will continue to be withheld in full.

Exemption 2

Exemption 2 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(2) protects records that are "related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency." The withheld document 3 and portions of documents 1 and 2 are within the scope of the phrase "related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency" because they contain information that is predominantly internal, the disclosure of which would significantly risk circumvention of EPA regulations or statutes. Therefore, I have determined that the withheld material is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 2 of the FOIA.

Exemption 5

Exemption 5 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5), protects "inter-agency or intraagency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency." The documents and portions of documents that were withheld under Exemption 5 of the FOIA are exempt from disclosure because they are inter-agency or intra-agency memoranda or letters generated by EPA employees and because the documents contain information that is protected by the attorney work-product privilege, the attorney-client privilege, and the deliberative process privilege.

Attorney work-product privilege

Exemption 5 of the FOIA protects from disclosure a record, or portion of a record, that is subject to the attorney work-product privilege. The attorney work-product privilege protects documents prepared by, or at the direction of, an attorney in anticipation of litigation or during litigation. The withheld documents 4 and 10 were prepared by an attorney both in anticipation of litigation and during litigation. Release of this material would allow scrutiny of EPA's sensitive litigation preparations. Therefore, I have determined that the withheld material is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 5 of the FOIA.

Attorney-client privilege

Exemption 5 of the FOIA protects from disclosure a record, or portion of a record, that is subject to the attorney-client privilege. The attorney-client privilege protects confidential communications between an attorney and his/her client relating to a legal matter for which the client has sought professional advice. The privilege applies to facts divulged by a client to the attorney, to opinions given by the attorney to the client based upon those facts, and to communications between attorneys which reflect client-supplied information. The withheld documents 5 and 6 are protected by the attorney-client privilege because they constitute communication between attorneys and their clients. Release of this withheld material would allow scrutiny of sensitive, confidential communication between the attorneys and their clients. Therefore, I have determined that the withheld material is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 5 of the FOIA.

Deliberative process privilege

Exemption 5 of the FOIA also protects from disclosure a record, or portion of a record, that is subject to the deliberative process privilege. The deliberative process privilege protects documents that are both predecisional and deliberative. The withheld documents and portions of documents 1, 2 and 3 are protected by the deliberative process privilege because they reflect the internal discussions, advice, analysis and recommendations that were being considered during EPA's decision-making process. Release of the withheld material would discourage open, frank discussions on matters of policy between subordinates and superiors and prematurely disclose proposed policies

before they are finally adopted. Therefore, I have determined that the withheld material is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 5 of the FOIA.

Exemption 7(A)

Exemption 7(A) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(A), protects from disclosure "records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information . . . could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings." The withheld documents 3 and 5 were compiled for law enforcement purposes. The documents were compiled by EPA for the purpose of enforcing the Safe Drinking Water Act. Further, the production of these materials could reasonably be expected to interfere with ongoing enforcement proceedings, because it would hinder the government's ability to control or shape the investigation, and it would prematurely reveal the government's evidence or strategy. Therefore, I have determined that the withheld material is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 7(A) of the FOIA.

Exemption 7(C)

Exemption 7(C) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(C), exempts from disclosure "records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information . . . could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." The withheld portions of documents within documents 1, 2, 4c, 7, 8 and 9 include information compiled for law enforcement purposes. The documents were compiled by EPA for the purpose of enforcing the Safe Drinking Water Act. The documents contain information relating to the identities of law enforcement personnel. The production of this information could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of these individuals, because it would create the potential for harassment. Therefore, I have determined that the withheld material is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 7(C) of the FOIA.

Reasonably segregable information

I have determined that some of the withheld documents contain reasonably segregable information that may be released. A copy of that material is enclosed. I have further determined that there is no other reasonably segregable nonexempt information.

Conclusion

This letter constitutes EPA's final determination on your appeal. In accordance with 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(B), you have the right to seek judicial review of this



On September 14, 2004, EPA inspected the Gene A. Wilson #1 injection well located on the property of Mr. Gene A. Wilson in Lawrence County, KY. Based on the condition of the well and a review of the well records file, the well was determined to be temporarily abandoned. The records file for the well shows that the well was last tested for mechanical integrity on October 15, 1993.

On February 9, 2005, a Notice of Violation and Opportunity to Show Cause letter was mailed to Mr. Wilson notifying him of the non-compliant status of the well and giving him the opportunity for a show-cause conference.

On February 17, 2005, at 9:00 AM EST, a show-cause conference call was held with Mr. Wilson and Region 4 Associate Regional Counsel, and myself, to discuss the non-compliant status of the well. The conference further verified the alleged violations and Mr. Wilson was informed that the well must be brought into compliance and that a penalty would be assessed for the violations. Mr. Wilson strongly denied that the well was abandoned and strongly objected to a penalty being assessed. informed Mr. Wilson of the inability-to-pay process but he declined to agree to provide the needed financial information. A second conference call was scheduled for March 4, 2005, at 10:00 AM EST. In a letter dated February 21, 2005, Mr. Wilson provided a summary based on his perspective of the first conference call.

On March 4, 2005 at 10:00 AM EST, a second conference call was held with the same parties. Mr. Wilson stated his intention to have the well plugged but still objected strongly to a penalty. He expressed his desire to have an administrative hearing. informed him that an administrative complaint would have to be issued to start the process. In a letter dated March 31, 2005, Mr. Wilson again provided a summary based on his perspective of the second conference call.
