CONSENT AGREEMENT

I. Statutory Authority

1. This is a civil penalty proceeding pursuant to Section 309(g)(2)(A) of the Clean Water Act ("CWA"), 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(2)(A), and the *Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties, Issuance of Compliance or Corrective Action Orders and the Revocation, Termination or Suspension of Permits*, including Subpart I, published at 64 Fed. Reg. 40176 (July 23, 1999) and codified at 40 Code of Federal Regulations ("C.F.R.") Part 22.

2. The authority to take action under Section 309(g)(2)(A) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(2)(A), is vested in the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"). The Administrator has delegated this authority to the Regional Administrator, Region 4, who in turn has delegated this authority to the Director of the Water Management Division, who in turn has delegated this authority to the Chief of the Water Programs Enforcement Branch of EPA, Region 4 ("Complainant").

II. Allegations

3. At all times relevant to this action, Walton Land Development, LLC, ("Respondent"), was a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and is, therefore, a "person" within the meaning of Section 502(5) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1362(5).

4. At all times relevant to this action, Respondent owned and/or operated a construction site known as Walton Towne Center ("Facility") located at KY Highway 16 and I-75 in Walton, Kentucky.

5. To accomplish the objective of the CWA, defined in Section 101(a) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1251(a), to restore and maintain the chemical, physical and biological integrity of the nation's waters, Section 301(a) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1311(a), prohibits the discharge of

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pollutants by any person into waters of the United States except as in compliance with a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("NPDES") Permit issued pursuant to Section 402 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1342.

6. Section 402 of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1342, establishes an NPDES Permit Program authorizing EPA or authorized states to administer the NPDES Permit Program, including the issuance of NPDES permits allowing for the discharge of pollutants, including storm water, into navigable waters subject to specific terms and conditions. EPA has granted the Commonwealth of Kentucky, through the Department for Environmental Protection ("KDEP"), approval to issue NPDES permits pursuant to Section 402(b) of the CWA.

7. The KDEP issued the *General KPDES Permit for Storm Water Point Source Discharges, Construction Activities* ("Permit"), Permit No. KYR10, in accordance with the provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 224 16-050 and pursuant to 401 Kentucky Administrative Regulations ("KAR") 5:055, Sections 1 and 5 and the CWA. The Permit was effective October 1, 2002, and expires September 30, 2007.

8. The KDEP is responsible for the issuance, compliance and enforcement of Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 224 16-050 and 401 KAR 5:055, Sections 1 and 5, and the approval of coverage under the Permit upon submission and approval of a Notice of Intent ("NOI") requesting Permit coverage.

9. On January 20, 2006, Respondent submitted an NOI to KDEP requesting permit coverage for its Facility.

10. Part II of the Permit incorporates 401 KAR 5:065 Section 1 by reference.

A. 401 KAR 5:065 Section 1(4) requires the Permittee to take all reasonable steps to minimize or prevent any discharge in violation of the Permit which has a reasonable likelihood of adversely affecting human health or the environment.

B. 401 KAR 5:065 Section 1(5) of the Permit requires the Permittee to properly operate and maintain at all times all facilities and systems of treatment and control and related appurtenances which are installed or used by the Permittee to achieve compliance with the conditions of the Permit.

11. Part IV of the Permit requires the Permittee to modify its Best Management Practices ("BMP") Plan within seven days whenever there is a change in design, construction, operation, or maintenance of the site which has a significant effect on the potential for the discharge of pollutants to surface waters.

12. Part IV.A of the Permit requires the Permittee to provide in the BMP Plan a clear description of the nature of the construction activity, the order of major soil disturbing activities, estimates of the total project area and the total disturbed area, the post construction runoff

coefficient, any existing data describing soil condition or discharge quality, receiving water name, and a site map. The site map shall indicate drainage patterns and show approximate slopes after grading, areas of disturbance, the location of control measures, surface waters or wetlands, and storm water discharge locations.

13. Part IV.B of the Permit requires the Permittee to provide in the BMP Plan a clear description of what sediment and erosion control measures will be used and when they will be implemented.

14. Part IV.B.2 of the Permit requires the Permittee to use silt fences or other equivalent structural practices on all side and down slope borders of the site. Alternatively, a sediment basin shall be used that provides 3,600 cubic feet of storage capacity per disturbed acre. For common locations that serve more than ten disturbed acres at one time, a sediment basin must be used if possible. Structural practices may be subject to Section 404 of the CWA.

15. Part IV.E of the Permit requires the Permittee to include in the BMP Plan a clear description of the maintenance procedures necessary to keep the control measures in good and effective operating condition.

16. Part IV.F of the Permit requires the Permittee to ensure that qualified personnel inspect all storm water control measures, discharge locations, vehicle exits, disturbed areas of the construction site and material storage areas at least once every seven days and within 24 hours of the end of a storm that is 0.5 inches or greater, and areas that have been temporarily or finally stabilized at least once a month. The Permittee shall make a report summarizing the scope of the inspection, names and qualifications of personnel making the inspection, the date of the inspection, major observations relating to the implementation of the BMP Plan, and any corrective actions. The reports shall also be signed in accordance with Part II of the Permit and 401 KAR 5:065 Section 1(11).

17. Part IV.H of the Permit requires the Permittee to identify all contractors or subcontractors that will implement each control measure identified in the BMP Plan, and have all contractors and subcontractors sign a certification statement.

18. On May 24, 2006 representatives of EPA, in conjunction with the KDEP, performed a Compliance Storm Water Evaluation Inspection ("CSWEI") at Respondent's Facility. The CSWEI was to evaluate the treatment and disposal of storm water at the Facility in accordance with the CWA, the regulations promulgated thereunder at 40 C.F.R. § 122.26, and its implementing regulations.

19. As a result of the CSWEI, EPA Region 4 has determined that storm water associated with industrial activity was discharged from the Facility within the meaning of Section 402(p) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1342(p), and its implementing regulations.

20. During the CSWEI, EPA inspectors observed the following:

A. Respondent failed to take all reasonable steps to minimize or prevent any discharge in violation of the Permit which had a reasonable likelihood of adversely affecting human health or the environment as required by Part II of the Permit and 401 KAR 5:065 Section 1(4). Sediment was being discharged at the rock check dams in the southern portion of the Facility.

B. Respondent failed to reduce the pollutants in storm water discharges by properly operating and maintaining all facilities and systems of treatment and control and related appurtenances in accordance with Part II of the Permit and 401 KAR 5:065 Section 1(5). The rock check dams in the southern portion of the Facility were full of sediment and not maintained.

C. Respondent failed to modify the BMP Plan when there was a change in design, construction, operation, or maintenance of the Facility, as required by Part IV of the Permit. A rock check dam was constructed in a stream but was not included in the BMP Plan.

D. Respondent failed to include in its BMP Plan the order of all major soil disturbing activities and a sequence or schedule of implementation of the erosion and sediment control measures on-site, as required by Part IV.A and Part IV.B of the Permit.

E. Respondent failed to install sedimentation basins that would provide 3,600 cubic feet of storage capacity per disturbed acre, as required by Part IV.B.2 of the Permit.

F. Respondent failed to include in its BMP Plan a clear description of the maintenance procedures necessary to keep control measures in good and effective operating condition, as required by Part IV.E of the Permit.

G. Respondent failed to make a report summarizing the scope of inspections, names and qualifications of personnel making the inspections, and major observations relating to the implementation of the BMP Plan, as required by Part IV.F of the Permit

H. Respondent failed to identify all contractors or subcontractors that implemented each control measure identified in the BMP Plan, as required by Part IV.H of the Permit.

21. Therefore, Respondent violated Sections 301 and 402(p) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. §§ 1311 and 1342(p), by failing to comply with the Permit, and for discharges not authorized by the Permit.

III. Stipulations and Findings

22. Complainant and Respondent have conferred for the purpose of settlement pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.18 and desire to resolve this matter and settle the allegations described herein without a formal hearing. Therefore, before the filing of a Complaint conforming to 40 C.F.R. § 22.14, and without the taking of any evidence or testimony, the making of any argument, or the adjudication of any issue in this matter, and in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.13(b), this Consent Agreement and Final Order ("CA/FO") will simultaneously commence and conclude this matter.

23. For the purposes of this CA/FO, Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations set out above and neither admits nor denies the factual allegations set out above.

24. Respondent hereby waives its right to contest the allegations set out above and its right to appeal the Final Order accompanying this Consent Agreement.

25. Respondent consents to the assessment of and agrees to pay the civil penalty as set forth in this CA/FO and consents to the other conditions set forth in this CA/FO.

26. By signing this CA/FO, Respondent certifies that the information it has supplied concerning this matter was at the time of submission, and is now, truthful, accurate, and complete for each such submission, response and statement. Respondent realizes that there are significant penalties for submitting false or misleading information, including the possibility of fines and/or imprisonment for knowing submission of such information.

27. EPA reserves the right to assess and collect any and all civil penalties for any violation described herein to the extent that any information or certification provided by Respondent was materially false or inaccurate at the time such information or certification was provided to EPA.

28. Complainant and Respondent agree to settle this matter by their execution of this CA/FO. The parties agree that the settlement of this matter is in the public interest and that this CA/FO is consistent with the applicable requirements of the CWA.

IV. Payment

29. Pursuant to Section 309(g)(2)(A) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(2)(A), and 40 C.F.R. Part 19, and considering the nature of the violations and other relevant factors, EPA has determined that Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) is an appropriate civil penalty to settle this action.

30. Respondent shall submit payment of the penalty specified in the preceding paragraph within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this CA/FO via a cashier's or certified check, payable to the order of "Treasurer, United States of America." The check shall reference

on its face the name of Respondent and the Docket Number of this CA/FO. Such payment shall be tendered to:

32. The penalty amount specified above shall represent civil penalties assessed by EPA and shall not be deductible for purposes of federal taxes.

33. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. Part 13 and 31 U.S.C. § 3717 et seq., if EPA does not receive payment of the penalty assessed by this CA/FO in full by its due date, interest shall accrue on the unpaid balance from the due date through the date of payment at an annual rate equal to the rate of the current value of funds to the United States Treasury as prescribed and published by the Secretary of the Treasury. If all or part of the payment is overdue, EPA will assess a late-payment handling charge of \$15.00, with an additional delinquent notice charge of \$15.00 for each subsequent thirty (30) day period. EPA will also assess on a monthly basis an up to six percent (6%) per annum penalty on any principal amount not paid within ninety (90) days of the due date.

34. Pursuant to Section 309(g)(9) of the CWA, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g)(9), failure by Respondent to pay the penalty assessed by the CA/FO in full by its due date may subject Respondent to a civil action to collect the assessed penalty plus interest (at currently prevailing rates from the effective date of this CA/FO), attorney's fees, costs for collection proceedings and a quarterly nonpayment penalty for each quarter during which such failure to pay persists. Such nonpayment penalty shall be in an amount equal to twenty percent (20%) of the aggregate

amount of such penalty and nonpayment penalty which are unpaid as of the beginning of such quarter. In any such collection action, the validity, amount and appropriateness of the penalty and of this CA/FO shall not be subject to review.

V. General Provisions

35. This CA/FO shall not relieve Respondent of its obligation to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state, or local law, nor shall it be construed to be a ruling on, or determination of, any issue related to any federal, state, or local permit. Other than as expressed herein, compliance with this CA/FO shall not be a defense to any actions subsequently commenced pursuant to federal laws and regulations administered by EPA.

36. Nothing in this CA/FO shall be construed as prohibiting, altering, or in any way limiting the ability of the United States to seek any other remedies or sanctions available by virtue of Respondent's violation of this CA/FO or of the statutes and regulations upon which this CA/FO is based, or for Respondent's violation of any federal or state statute, regulation or permit.

37. Except as otherwise set forth herein, this CA/FO constitutes a settlement by Complainant and Respondent of all claims for civil penalties pursuant to the CWA with respect to only those violations alleged in this CA/FO. Except as otherwise set forth herein, compliance with this CA/FO shall resolve the allegations of violations contained herein. Nothing in this CA/FO is intended to nor shall be construed to operate in any way to resolve any criminal liability of Respondent, or other liability resulting from violations that were not alleged in this CA/FO. Other than as expressed herein, Complainant does not waive any right to bring an enforcement action against Respondent for violation of any federal or state statute, regulation or permit, to initiate an action for imminent and substantial endangerment, or to pursue criminal enforcement.

38. Each undersigned representative of the parties to this CA/FO certifies that he or she is fully authorized to enter into the terms and conditions of this CA/FO and to execute and legally bind that party to it.

39. This CA/FO applies to and is binding upon Respondent and its officers, directors, employees, agents, successors and assigns.

40. Any change in the legal status of the Facility, including but not limited to any transfer of assets of real or personal property, shall not alter Respondent's responsibilities under this CA/FO.

41. Each party shall bear its own costs and attorneys fees in connection with the action resolved by this CA/FO.

42. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.5, the individuals below are authorized to receive service relating to this proceeding.

45. The effective date of this CA/FO shall be the date on which the CA/FO is filed with the Regional Hearing Clerk.

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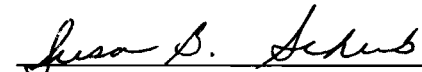
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FINAL ORDER

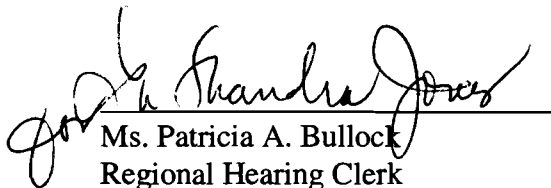
