**CONSENT AGREEMENT AND
FINAL ORDER**

I. AUTHORITY

1.1. This Consent Agreement and Final Order (“CAFO”) is issued under the authority vested in the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (“EPA”) by Section 325 of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (“EPCRA”), 42 U.S.C. § 11045.

1.2. The Administrator has delegated the authority to issue the Final Order contained in Part V of this CAFO to the Regional Administrator of EPA Region 10, who has redelegated this authority to the Regional Judicial Officer in EPA Region 10.

1.3. Pursuant to Section 325 of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11045, and in accordance with the “Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties,” 40 C.F.R. Part 22, EPA issues, and Washington Crab Producers, Inc. (“Respondent”) agrees to issuance of, the Final Order contained in Part V of this CAFO.

II. PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

2.1. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.13(b) and 22.18(b), issuance of this CAFO commences this proceeding, which will conclude when the Final Order contained in Part V of this CAFO becomes effective.

2.2. The Director of the Office of Compliance and Enforcement, EPA Region 10 (“Complainant”) has been delegated the authority pursuant to Section 325 of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11045, to sign consent agreements between EPA and the party against whom an administrative penalty for violations of EPCRA is proposed to be assessed.

2.3. Part III of this CAFO contains a concise statement of the factual and legal basis for the alleged violations of EPCRA together with the specific provisions of EPCRA and its implementing regulations that Respondent is alleged to have violated.

III. ALLEGATIONS

3.1. Section 312(a) of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11022(a), and its implementing regulations at 40 C.F.R. Part 370, require the owner or operator of a facility, which is required by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (“OSHA”) to prepare or have available a material safety data sheet (“MSDS”) for a hazardous chemical, to prepare and submit an Emergency and Hazardous Chemical Inventory Form (Tier I or Tier II, as described in 40 C.F.R. Part 370) to the local emergency planning committee (“LEPC”), the state emergency response commission (“SERC”), and the fire department with jurisdiction over the facility by March 1, 1988, and annually thereafter on March 1. The form must contain the information required by

Section 312(d) of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11022(d), covering all hazardous chemicals required by OSHA to have an MSDS that are present at the facility at any one time during the preceding year in amounts equal to or exceeding threshold quantities.

3.2. Under Section 329(4) of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11049(4), “facility” means all buildings, equipment, structures, and other stationary items that are located on a single site or on contiguous or adjacent sites and which are owned or operated by the same person (or by any person which controls, is controlled, or under common control with, such person).

3.3. Under Section 329(7) of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11049(7), “person” means, *inter alia*, a corporation.

3.4. The OSHA Hazard Communication Standard (“OSHA Standard”), 29 C.F.R. § 1910.1200(b), requires employers to provide information to their employees about extremely hazardous chemicals and hazardous chemicals to which they are exposed by means of, *inter alia*, an MSDS. The OSHA Standard applies to any chemical which is known to be present in the workplace in such a manner that employees may be exposed under normal conditions of use or in a foreseeable emergency.

3.5. Anhydrous ammonia is defined as an extremely hazardous chemical under the OSHA Standard.

3.6. The OSHA Standard requires an MSDS to be prepared, or available, for anhydrous ammonia.

3.7. Nitrogen is defined as a hazardous chemical under the OSHA Standard.

3.8. The OSHA Standard requires an MSDS to be prepared, or available, for nitrogen.

3.9. Respondent is a corporation, incorporated in the State of Washington.

3.10. Respondent owns and operates a facility located at 1980 North Nyhus Street, Westport, Washington 98595 (“Washington Crab Producers Facility”).

3.11. Respondent processes seafood for the consumer market at the Washington Crab Producers Facility.

3.12. During 2012, Respondent stored approximately 1,670 pounds of anhydrous ammonia and 72,000 pounds of nitrogen at the Washington Crab Producers Facility.

3.13. Respondent did not timely submit an Emergency and Hazardous Chemical Inventory Form for anhydrous ammonia and nitrogen stored at the Washington Crab Producers Facility to the LEPC, SERC, and fire department with jurisdiction over the facility, for calendar year 2012, in violation of Section 312(a) of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11022(a).

3.17. Under Section 325(c)(1) of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11045(c)(1), EPA may assess a civil penalty of up to \$37,500 for each day of violation of Section 312 of EPCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 11022.

IV. CONSENT AGREEMENT

4.1. Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations contained in this CAFO.

4.2. Respondent neither admits nor denies the specific factual allegations set forth in this CAFO.

4.3. EPA has determined and Respondent agrees that an appropriate amount to settle this action is \$16,551.

4.4. Respondent agrees to pay the total civil penalty set forth in Paragraph 4.3 within 30 days of the effective date of the Final Order contained in Part V of this CAFO.

4.5. Payment under this CAFO must be made by cashier's check or certified check payable to the order of "Treasurer, United States of America" and delivered to the following address:

4.7. If Respondent fails to pay the penalty assessed by this CAFO in full by the due date, the entire unpaid balance of penalty and accrued interest shall become immediately due and owing. If such a failure to pay occurs, Respondent may be subject to a civil action to collect the assessed penalty under EPCRA, together with interest, handling charges, and nonpayment

penalties, as set forth below. In any such collection action, the validity, amount, and appropriateness of such penalty shall not be subject to review.

a. Interest. Any unpaid portion of the assessed penalty shall bear interest at the rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717(a)(1) from the effective date of the Final Order set forth in Part V, provided, however, that no interest shall be payable on any portion of the assessed penalty that is paid within 30 days of the effective date of the Final Order contained herein.

b. Handling Charge. Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717(e)(1), a monthly handling charge of \$15 shall be paid if any portion of the assessed penalty is more than 30 days past due.

c. Nonpayment Penalty. Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717(e)(2), a nonpayment penalty of 6% per annum shall be paid on any portion of the assessed penalty that is more than 90 days past due, which nonpayment penalty shall be calculated as of the date the underlying penalty first becomes past due.

4.8. Respondent agrees to implement a Supplemental Environmental Project (“SEP”) consisting of the purchase of a thermal imaging camera and charging and carrying equipment to be given to the Westport Fire Department, Westport, Washington. Respondent agrees to implement and complete the SEP within 60 days of the effective date of this CAFO, in accordance with all provisions described in this Consent Agreement and Attachment A to this CAFO. The parties agree that this SEP is intended to secure significant human health and environmental benefits by providing the local fire department with a thermal imaging camera

and charging and carrying equipment that can be used in the event of a release of a hazardous chemical or substance or other emergency in the local area.

4.9. Respondent's deadline to perform the SEP shall be excused or extended if such performance is prevented or delayed solely by events which constitute a Force Majeure event. A Force Majeure event is defined as any event arising from causes beyond the reasonable control of Respondent, including its employees, agents, consultants, and contractors, which could not be overcome by due diligence and which delays or prevents performance of a SEP within the specified time period. A Force Majeure event does not include, *inter alia*, increased cost of performance, changed economic circumstances, changed labor relations, normal precipitation or climate events, changed circumstances arising out of the sale, lease, or other transfer or conveyance of title or ownership or possession of a site, or failure to obtain federal, state, or local permits.

4.10. Respondent certifies to the truth, accuracy and completeness of all cost information provided to EPA in connection with EPA's approval of the SEP, and that Respondent in good faith estimates that the cost to implement the SEP is \$11,686.56.

4.11. Respondent also certifies that, as of the date of this Consent Agreement, Respondent is not required to perform or develop the SEP by any federal, state, or local law or regulation; nor is Respondent required to perform or develop the SEP by another agreement, under a grant, or as injunctive relief in any other case. Respondent further certifies: that it has not received, and is not presently negotiating to receive, credit in any other enforcement action

for the SEP; that the SEP is not a project that Respondent was planning or intending to construct, perform, or implement other than in settlement of the claims resolved in this Consent Agreement; and that Respondent will not receive any reimbursement for any portion of the SEP from any other person or entity. For federal income tax purposes, Respondent agrees that it will neither capitalize in inventory or basis nor deduct any costs or expenditures incurred in performing the SEP.

4.12. Respondent hereby certifies that it is not a party to any open federal financial assistance transaction that is funding or could be used to fund the same activity as the SEP described in Attachment A. Respondent further certifies that it has inquired of the Westport Fire Department, Westport, Washington, whether it is a party to any open federal financial transaction that is funding or could be used to fund the same activity as the SEP and has been informed by the recipient that it is not a party to such transaction.

4.13. Respondent shall submit a SEP Completion Report to EPA within 90 days after the effective date of the CAFO. The SEP Completion Report shall contain the following information:

- a. A description of the SEP as implemented;
- b. Certification that the SEP has been fully implemented pursuant to the provisions of this CAFO;
- c. A description of any problems encountered and the solutions thereto; and

d. A description of the environmental and public health benefits resulting from implementation of the SEP.

4.14. Unless otherwise instructed in writing by EPA, Respondent shall submit all notices and reports required by this CAFO by first class mail, overnight mail, or hand delivery to:

4.15. Respondent agrees that EPA may inspect Respondent's records related to the SEP at any reasonable time in order to confirm that the SEP is being undertaken in conformity with the representations made herein.

4.16. Respondent shall maintain legible copies of documentation of the underlying data for documents or reports submitted to EPA pursuant to this CAFO until the SEP Completion Report is accepted pursuant to Paragraph 4.17, and Respondent shall provide the documentation of any such underlying data to EPA within 15 days of a written request for such information. In all documents or reports including, without limitation, the SEP Completion Report submitted to EPA pursuant to this CAFO, Respondent shall, by a corporate officer, sign and certify under penalty of law that the information contained in such a document or report is true, accurate, and not misleading by signing the following statement:

I certify under penalty of law that I have examined and am familiar with the information submitted in this document and all attachments and that, based on my inquiry

of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the information is true, accurate, and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment.

4.17. Following receipt of the SEP Completion Report described in Paragraph 4.13, EPA will do one of the following: (i) accept the Report; (ii) reject the Report, notify Respondent, in writing, of deficiencies in the Report, and provide Respondent an additional 30 days in which to correct any deficiencies; or (iii) reject the Report and seek stipulated penalties in accordance with Paragraph 4.19.

4.18. If Respondent fails to satisfactorily complete the SEP as contemplated by this CAFO and this failure was not caused solely by events which constitute a Force Majeure as defined by Paragraph 4.9, then stipulated penalties shall be due and payable by Respondent to EPA upon demand in accordance with Paragraph 4.19. The determination of whether the SEP has been satisfactorily completed and whether Respondent has made a good faith, timely effort to implement the SEP is reserved to the sole discretion of EPA.

4.19. If Respondent fails to satisfactorily complete the SEP required by this CAFO, Respondent shall pay stipulated penalties, upon written demand from EPA, in the following amount for each day that each SEP remains incomplete:

4.20. Respondent shall pay stipulated penalties within 15 days of receipt of a written demand by EPA for such penalties. Payment shall be in accordance with the provisions of Paragraphs 4.5 and 4.6. Interest and late charges shall be paid as stated in Paragraph 4.7.

4.21. Any public statement, oral or written, in print, film, or other media, made by Respondent making reference to the SEP shall include the following language: "This project was undertaken in connection with the settlement of an administrative enforcement action taken by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency under the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act."

4.22. This CAFO shall not relieve Respondent of its obligation to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state, or local law, nor shall it be construed to be a ruling on, or determination of, any issue related to any federal, state, or local permit, nor shall it be construed to constitute EPA approval of the equipment or technology installed by Respondent in connection with the SEP undertaken pursuant to this CAFO.

4.23. The penalty described in Paragraph 4.3, including any additional costs incurred under Paragraphs 4.7, 4.8, and 4.19, represents an administrative civil penalty assessed by EPA and shall not be deductible for purposes of federal taxes.

4.24. The undersigned representative of Respondent certifies that he or she is authorized to enter into the terms and conditions of this CAFO and to bind Respondent to this document.

4.25. The undersigned representative of Respondent also certifies that, as of the date of Respondent's signature of this CAFO, Respondent has corrected the violation(s) alleged in Part III above.

4.26. Each party shall bear its own costs and attorneys fees in bringing or defending this action.

4.27. Respondent expressly waives any right to contest the allegations and waives any right to appeal the Final Order set forth in Part V.

4.28. The provisions of this CAFO shall bind Respondent and its agents, servants, employees, successors, and assigns.

4.29. The above provisions are STIPULATED AND AGREED upon by Respondent and EPA Region 10.




V. FINAL ORDER

This CAFO does not waive, extinguish, or otherwise affect Respondent's obligations to comply with all applicable provisions of EPCRA and regulations or permits issued thereunder.

5.3. This Final Order shall become effective upon filing.

SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECT ("SEP")

Respondent will purchase the equipment listed below and give it to the Westport Fire Department, P.O. Box 728, Westport, Washington 98595. This item was specifically identified by Dennis Benn, Chief of the Westport Fire Department, as equipment that will improve capabilities of first responders from the fire department in responding the hazardous materials emergencies in the local community in a safe and effective manner. Respondent will complete the SEP within 60 days of the effective date of the Consent Agreement and Final Order.

Thermal Imaging Camera

Respondent will purchase an Evolution 5800 Thermal Imaging Camera, complete with user-selectable palettes, 2x digital zoon, heat seeker, and quick temperature.

Estimated Cost: \$10,198.98

Charging and Carrying Equipment

Respondent will purchase a fire station kit for the thermal imaging camera which consists of two rechargeable lithium-ion batteries, a single-unit AC charger, a retractable lanyard, a carabiner, and a hard plastic carrying case.

Estimated Cost: \$556.92

Sales Tax and Shipping Costs

Respondent will pay sales tax and shipping for the thermal imaging camera and the charging and carrying equipment.

Estimated Cost: \$930.66

TOTAL ESTIMATED COST: \$11,686.56
