) **AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER**
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EXPEDITED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

1. SNEH Enterprises LLC and VIRU Enterprises LLC (“Respondents”) and the Director, Enforcement and Compliance Assurance Division, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region III (“Complainant”) enter into this Expedited Settlement Agreement (“Agreement”) pursuant to Section 9006 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (“RCRA”), as amended, 42 U.S.C § 6991e, and the *Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits* (“Consolidated Rules of Practice”), 40 C.F.R. Part 22 (with specific reference to 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.13(b), 22.18(b)(2), and (3)). The Administrator has delegated the authority to enter into this Agreement to the Regional Administrator who, in turn, has delegated it to the Complainant.
2. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region III (“EPA”) has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 9006 of RCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 6991e, and 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.1(a)(4) and 22.4 of the Consolidated Rules of Practice.
3. Complainant alleges that, at all times relevant to the allegations described in this Agreement, Respondent was and continues to be a “person,” and the “operator” and/or “owner” of “underground storage tanks” (“USTs”) and “UST systems,” located at Summit Fuels UST Gas Station Mini Mart, 4495 Summit Bridge Road, Middletown DE 19709 (“Facility”).
4. Complainant alleges and finds that Respondent failed to comply with specific requirements of Subtitle I of RCRA, 42 U.S.C. §§ 6991 *et seq.*, its implementing regulations at 40 C.F.R. Part 280, and the federally-authorized Delaware UST management program regulations, set

forth in the Delaware Regulations Governing Underground Storage Tanks (“DRGUST”).

5. On February 2, 2021, a representative of EPA sent an Information Request Letter in lieu of an onsite Compliance Evaluation Inspection in an effort to maintain social distancing during the COVID 19 pandemic. Based on information provided to EPA, the following USTs are located at the Facility:
 - a. A 15,000-gallon tank that was installed in or about August 2001, and that, at all times relevant hereto, routinely contained regular-grade gasoline, a “regulated substance” as that term is defined in Section 9001(7) of RCRA, 42. U.S.C. § 6991(7), and DRGUST Part A Section 2 (hereinafter “UST No. “1”).
 - b. A 8,000-gallon tank that was installed in or about August 2001, and that, at all times relevant hereto, routinely contained premium-grade gasoline, a “regulated substance” as that term is defined in Section 9001(7) of RCRA, 42. U.S.C. § 6991(7), and DRGUST Part A Section 2 (hereinafter “UST No. “2”).
 - c. A 7,000-gallon tank that was installed in or about August 2001, and that, at all times relevant hereto, routinely contained diesel, a “regulated substance” as that term is defined in Section 9001(7) of RCRA, 42. U.S.C. § 6991(7), and DRGUST Part A Section 2 (hereinafter “UST No. “3”).
6. Complainant has identified the following violations:
 - a. From at least 4/15/20 until 5/18/20 and from at least 8/14/20 until 3/30/21, Respondent failed to properly conduct tank release detection on UST No. 1, in violation of DRGUST Part B 1.07 and 2.05 and 40 C.F.R. § 280.41(a);
 - b. From at least 4/15/20 until 5/18/20 and from at least 8/14/20 until 3/21/21, Respondent failed to properly conduct tank release detection on UST No. 2, in violation of DRGUST Part B 1.07 and 2.05 and 40 C.F.R. § 280.41(a);
 - c. From at least 4/14/20 until 5/18/20 and from at least 8/14/20 until 4/29/21, Respondent failed to properly conduct tank release detection on UST No. 3, in violation of DRGUST Part B 1.07 and 2.05 and 40 C.F.R. § 280.41(a).
7. Complainant and Respondent agree that settlement of this matter for a penalty of \$2,820 (**TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS**) is in the public interest. In calculating this amount, Complainant considered the statutory factors set forth in Section 9006(c) of RCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 6991e(c), and the Interim Consolidated Enforcement Penalty Policy for Underground Storage Tank Regulations and Revised Field Citation Program and ESA Pilot, effective October 5, 2018.
8. Respondent agrees that, within 30 days of the effective date of this Agreement, Respondent shall make a payment of \$2,820 (**TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS**) by one of four methods: 1) electronic funds transfer (“EFT”), 2) Automated Clearinghouse, 3) Pay.gov, or 4) a cashier’s check or certified check made out to “**United States Treasury**” with the case name, address and docket number of this Agreement

c. Payments made through Pay.gov:

9. Within 24 hours of payment, the Respondent shall also send proof of payment (a copy of the check, confirmation of credit card or debit card payment, confirmation of wire or automated clearinghouse transfer), by electronic mail to:

10. In signing this Agreement, the Respondent: admits the jurisdictional allegations in this Agreement; neither admits nor denies the specific factual allegations in this Agreement, except as provided in the jurisdictional admission above; agrees not to contest EPA's jurisdiction with respect to the execution of this Agreement, the issuance of the attached Final Order, or the enforcement the Agreement; expressly waives its right to a hearing on any issue of law or fact in this Agreement and any right to appeal the accompanying Final Order; consents to the issuance of the Agreement and agrees to comply with its terms; agrees to bear its own costs and attorney's fees; and agrees not to deduct for federal tax purposes the civil penalty assessed in this Agreement and Final Order.
11. By its signature below, the Respondent certifies, subject to civil and criminal penalties for making a false submission to the United States Government, that (1) he or she has corrected the alleged violations, and (2) any documentation or information that he or she provided to EPA was true and accurate.
12. This Agreement and the attached Final Order constitute a settlement by EPA of its claims for civil penalties for the violations alleged in this Agreement.
13. EPA reserves the right to commence action against any person, including Respondent, in response to any condition which EPA determines may present an imminent and substantial endangerment to the public health, public welfare, or the environment. In addition, this settlement is subject to all limitations on the scope of resolution and to the reservation of rights set forth in Sections 22.18(c) and 22.31(a) of the Consolidated Rules of Practice.

Further, EPA reserves any rights and remedies available to it under the RCRA, the RCRA regulations promulgated, and any other federal laws or regulations for which EPA has jurisdiction, to enforce the provisions of this Agreement, following its filing with the Regional Hearing Clerk.

14. Late payment of the agreed upon penalty may subject Respondent to interest, administrative costs and late payment penalties in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 13.11.
15. This Agreement is binding on the parties signing below and is effective upon filing, in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.31(b).
16. The undersigned representative certifies that she/he is fully authorized to execute this Agreement and to legally bind SNEH Enterprises LLC and VIRU Enterprises LLC.

FINAL ORDER

Complainant, the Director of the Enforcement and Compliance Assurance Division, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency - Region III, and Respondent, SNEH Enterprises LLC and VIRU Enterprises LLC, have executed a document entitled "Expedited Settlement Agreement," which I hereby ratify as a Consent Agreement in accordance with the *Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits* ("Consolidated Rules of Practice"), 40 C.F.R. Part 22, (with specific reference to Sections 22.13(b) and 22.18(b)(2) and (3)). The terms of the foregoing Expedited Settlement Agreement are accepted by the undersigned and incorporated herein as if set forth at length.

Based upon the representations of the parties in the attached Expedited Settlement Agreement, the penalty agreed to therein took into account the statutory factors set forth in Section 9006(c) of RCRA, 42 U.S.C. § 6991e(c), and the Interim Consolidated Enforcement Penalty Policy for Underground Storage Tank Regulations and Revised Field Citation Program and ESA Pilot, effective October 5, 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO Section 9006 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act ("RCRA"), as amended, 42 U.S.C. Section 6991e, and Section 22.18(b)(3) of the Consolidated Rules of Practice, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that Respondent pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$2,820 (**TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS**), in accordance with the payment provisions set forth in the Expedited Settlement Agreement, and comply with the terms and conditions of the Expedited Settlement Agreement.

This Final Order constitutes the final Agency action in this proceeding. This Final Order shall not in any case affect the right of the Agency or the United States to pursue appropriate injunctive or other equitable relief, or criminal sanctions for any violations of the law. This Final Order resolves only those causes of action alleged in the Expedited Settlement Agreement and does not waive, extinguish or otherwise affect Respondent's obligation to comply with all applicable provisions of Subtitle I of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 6991 et seq., and the regulations promulgated thereunder.

The effective date of the foregoing Expedited Settlement Agreement and this Final Order is the date on which this Final Order is filed with the Regional Hearing Clerk.
