("Respondent") agree to settle this matter and consent to the entry of this Consent Agreement and Final Order ("CAFO"). This CAFO simultaneously initiates and concludes this proceeding in accordance with 40 C.F.R. §§22.13(b) and 22.18(b).
33	A. AUTHORITY AND PARTIES
34	1. This administrative proceeding for the assessment of a civil administrative penalty
35 36	is initiated pursuant to section 14(a) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, 7 U.S.C. § 136, et seq. (hereinafter referred to as "FIFRA" or the "Act"), and the Consolidated
37	Rules of Practice Governing the Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits, 40 C.F.R. Part 22.
38 39	2. Complainant is the Manager of the Toxics Section of the Enforcement and

Compliance Assurance Division, EPA Region IX, who has been duly delegated to commence

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Respondent is a Delaware corporation headquartered in Dublin, California and with facilities and businesses in many locations, including California and Hawaii.

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# **B. STATUTORY AND REGULATORY AUTHORITIES**

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4. Under section 2(s) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. §136 s), a person is "any individual, partnership, association, corporation, or any organized group of persons whether incorporated or not."

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5. Under section 2(u) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. §136(u), a pesticide is, among other things, "any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling, or

- 6. The term "pest" includes (1) any insect, rodent, nematode, fungus, weed, or (2) any other form of terrestrial or aquatic plant or animal life or virus, bacteria, or other microorganism (except viruses, bacteria, or other micro-organisms on or in living man or other living animals) which the Administrator declares to be a pest under FIFRA section 25(c)(1). Section 2(t) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. §136(t).
- 7. The term "to distribute or sell" means to distribute, sell, offer for sale, hold for distribution, hold for sale, hold for shipment, ship, deliver for shipment, release for shipment, or receive and (having so received) deliver or offer to deliver. Section 2(gg) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(gg).

# Unregistered Pesticide

8. Section 12(a)(1)(A) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A), states that it is unlawful for any person in any State to distribute or sell to any person any pesticide that is not registered under the Act. See also 40 C.F.R. 152.15, which also provides that no person may distribute or sell any pesticide that is not registered under the Act, with certain exceptions not applicable here.

## Penalty

9. Any registrant, commercial applicator, wholesaler, dealer, retailer, or other distributor who violates any provision of the Act may be assessed a civil penalty of not more than \$23,494 for violations that occurred after November 2, 2015 and are assessed on or after January 6, 2023. Section 14(a)(1) of the Act, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a)(1), as amended by the Civil Monetary Penalty Inflation Adjustment Rule, 40 C.F.R. Part 19.

- 17. At all times relevant to this action, CIF Multi-Purpose Disinfectant Spray 500 ML is labeled as follows: The front label states "Effective against viruses" and "multipurpose disinfectant" and "kills 99.9% Germs" and "TABLES" "DOORKNOBS" "TOILETS" and "SINKS." The back label states "PROFESSIONAL MULTIPURPOSE DISINFECTANT" and lists ingredients as "Alcohol.denat, water (AQUA), sodium bicarbonate, Perfume, Benzalkonium Chloride, Limonene, Citronellol, Geraniol." The label contains neither an EPA product registration number nor an EPA establishment number.
- 18. At all times relevant to this action, Domestos Multi-Purpose Disinfectant Spray is labeled as follows: The front label states "Effective against viruses" and "multipurpose disinfectant" and "kills 99.9% Germs." The back label states "MULTIPURPOSE DISINFECTANT" and lists ingredients as "Alcohol.denat, water (AQUA), sodium bicarbonate, Perfume, Benzalkonium Chloride, Limonene, Citronellol, Geraniol." The label contains neither an EPA product registration number nor an EPA establishment number.
- 19. Bacteria including Salmonella, E. Coli and staphylococcus aureus, fungi, yeasts, algae, and virus, including the flu virus, and other micro-organisms including "germs" are each "pests" as that term is defined by FIFRA.
- 20. CIF Power & Shine Multi-Purpose Wipes (Ocean Fresh), CIF Power & Shine Multi-Purpose Wipes (Citrus Fresh), Domestos Professional Disinfecting Surface Wipes, CIF Multi-Purpose Disinfectant Spray, and Domestos Multi-Purpose Disinfectant Spray are each a "pesticide" as that term is defined by FIFRA.
- 21. CIF Power & Shine Multi-Purpose Wipes (Ocean Fresh), CIF Power & Shine Multi-Purpose Wipes (Citrus Fresh), Domestos Professional Disinfecting Surface Wipes, CIF

22. On or about February 3, 2021, Respondent "distributed or sold" as that term is defined by Section 2(gg) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(gg), CIF Power & Shine Multi-Purpose Wipes (Ocean Fresh), CIF Power & Shine Multi-Purpose Wipes (Citrus Fresh), Domestos Professional Disinfecting Surface Wipes, CIF Multi-Purpose Disinfectant Spray, and Domestos Multi-Purpose Disinfectant Spray. In each of these five instances, Respondent violated section 12(a)(1)(A) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A), by offering for sale an unregistered pesticide.

#### Count 6

- 23. On March 9, 2021, EPA Inspectors conducted an inspection of the Ross Dress for Less store located at 5412 Ygnacio Valley Blvd, Concord, California.
- 24. At the time of the EPA inspection, Respondent was offering for sale the product Avalanche Antimicrobial Tempered Glass Screen Protector.
- 25. At all times relevant to this action, Avalanche Antimicrobial Tempered Glass Screen Protector is labeled as follows: The front label states "ANTIMICROBIAL" in larger font size than the text stating "Tempered Glass Screen Protector for iPhone 6.1." The back label states "ANTIMICROBIAL" in larger font size than the text stating "Tempered Glass Screen Protector" and lists benefits that include "Silver-ion infused hybrid glass keeps the growth or reproduction of some microorganisms (bacteria, fungi, yeasts, algae, and viruses) below the necessary level within a certain period of time" and "the antimicrobial composition attacks bacteria while it rests on the surface." The label contains neither an EPA product registration number nor an EPA establishment number.
- 26. Avalanche Antimicrobial Tempered Glass Screen Protector is a "pesticide" as that term is defined by FIFRA.
- 27. Avalanche Antimicrobial Tempered Glass Screen Protector is not a registered pesticide under the Act.
- 28. At all times relevant to this action, Avalanche Antimicrobial Tempered Glass Screen Protector did not meet the requirements at 40 CFR 152.25(a) to be exempt from pesticide regulation. An exemption to the requirement for a pesticide to be registered exists for treated articles or substances when intended for use, and used, only in the manner specified at 40 CFR 152.25(a)("An article or substance treated with, or containing, a pesticide to protect the article or

29. On or about March 9, 2021, Respondent "distributed or sold" Avalanche Antimicrobial Tempered Glass Screen Protector as the term "to distribute or sell" is defined by Section 2(gg) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(gg). On or about March 9, 2021, Respondent violated section 12(a)(1)(A) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A), by offering for sale an unregistered pesticide.

#### D. RESPONDENTS' ADMISSIONS

30. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.18(b)(2), and for the purpose of this proceeding, Respondent (i) admits that EPA has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this CAFO and over Respondent; (ii) neither admits nor denies the specific factual allegations contained in Section I.C of this CAFO; (iii) consents to any and all conditions specified in this CAFO, (iv) agrees to pay, and consents to the assessment of, the civil administrative penalty under Section I.E of this CAFO; (v) waives any right to contest the allegations contained in Section I.C of this CAFO; and (vi) waives the right to appeal the proposed final order contained in this CAFO.

# E. CIVIL ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY

- 31. Respondent consents to the assessment of a civil administrative penalty in the amount of FIFTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$ 55,000) as final settlement and complete satisfaction of the civil claims against Respondent arising from the facts alleged in Section I.C of the CAFO and under the Act.
- a. Respondent shall pay the civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this CAFO by one of the methods listed below:
  - i. Respondent may pay online through the Department of the Treasury website at www.pay.gov. In the Search Public Form field, enter SFO 1.1,

If payment is not received in full by the date specified in Paragraph 31, interest, penalty and administrative costs will accrue from the effective date of this CAFO as described at 40 CFR §13.11. In addition, if this matter is referred to another department or agency (e.g., the Department of Justice, the Internal Revenue Service), that department or agency may assess its own administrative costs, in addition to EPA's administrative costs, for handling and collecting Respondent's overdue debt. Respondent's failure to pay in full the civil administrative penalty by its due date also may also lead to any or all of the following actions:

- a. The debt being referred to a credit reporting agency, a collection agency, or to the Department of Justice for filing of a collection action in the appropriate United States District Court. 40 C.F.R. §§ 13.13, 13.14, and 13.33. In any such collection action, the validity, amount, and appropriateness of the assessed penalty and of this CAFO shall not be subject to review.
- b. The debt being collected by administrative offset (i.e., the withholding of money payable by the United States to, or held by the United States for, a person to satisfy the debt the person owes the Government), which includes, but is not limited to, referral to the Internal Revenue Service for offset against income tax refunds. 40 C.F.R. Part 13, Subparts C and H.
- c. EPA may (i) suspend or revoke Respondent's licenses or other privileges; (ii) suspend or disqualify Respondent from doing business with EPA or engaging in programs EPA sponsors or funds; (iii) convert the method of payment under a grant or contract from an advanced payment to a reimbursement method; or (iv) revoke a grantee's or contractor's letter-of-credit. 40 C.F.R. §§ 13.17.

## F. RESPONDENT CERTIFICATION

34. In executing this CAFO, Respondent certifies that the information it has supplied concerning this matter was at the time of submission, and is at the time of signature to this CAFO, truthful, accurate, and complete; and that Respondent has corrected the violations alleged in Section I.C of this CAFO. Under 18 U.S.C. § 1001, submitting false or misleading information can result in significant penalties, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment for knowing submission of such information.

## G. RETENTION OF RIGHTS, BINDING EFFECT, ETC.

35. This Consent Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Respondent and EPA. Full payment of the civil penalty and any applicable interest charges or late fees or

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- 36. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.18(c), this CAFO only resolves Respondent's liabilities for federal civil penalties for the violations specifically alleged in Section I.C of this CAFO. Nothing in this CAFO is intended to or shall be construed to resolve: (i) any civil liability for violations of any provision of any federal, state, or local law, statute, regulation, rule, ordinance, or permit not specifically alleged in Section I.C of this CAFO; or (ii) any criminal liability. EPA specifically reserves any and all authorities, rights, and remedies available to it (including, but not limited to, injunctive or other equitable relief or criminal sanctions) to address any violation of this CAFO or any violation not specifically alleged in Section I.C of this CAFO. This CAFO does not exempt, relieve, modify, or affect in any way Respondent's duties to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, rules, ordinances, and permits.
- 37. Except as set forth in Paragraph <u>33</u> above, EPA and Respondent shall each bear its own fees, costs, and disbursements in this action.
- 38. For the purposes of state and federal income taxation, Respondent shall not claim a deduction for any civil penalty payment made pursuant to this CAFO.
- 39. This CAFO constitutes an enforcement action for purposes of considering Respondent's compliance history in any subsequent enforcement action. This CAFO will be available to the public and does not contain any confidential business information. Respondent further consents to accept electronic service of the fully executed CAFO, by electronic mail, to the following address: tracey.meyer@ros.com. Respondent understands that this e-mail address may be made public when the CAFO and Certificate of Service are filed and uploaded to a searchable database.
- 40. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.18(b)(3) and 22.31(b), the effective date of this CAFO shall be the date on which the accompanying Final Order, having been signed by the Regional Judicial Officer, is filed.
- 41. The provisions of this CAFO shall be binding on Respondent and on Respondent's officers, directors, employees, agents, servants, authorized representatives, successors, and assigns.
  - 42. The undersigned representatives of each party to this Consent Agreement certify
