Preliminary Statement

REGIONAL HEARING CLERK U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL

- 1. Complainant, the Director of the Land and Chemicals Division, United States ION AGENCY Environmental Protection Agency, Region 5, brought this administrative action seeking a civil penalty under Section 16(a) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a).
- On August 12, 2008, EPA filed the Complaint in this action against Respondents David Cohen and Harry Cohen Company, Inc. The Complaint alleges that in one contract to sell target housing and one contract to lease target housing, Respondents violated Section 1018(b)(5) of the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992, 42 U.S.C. § 4852d(b)(5), Section 409 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2689, 40 C.F.R. § 745.113(a)(2), (3),(4) and (7), and 40 C.F.R. § 745.113(b)(2), (3), (4), and (6).
 - Respondents filed an Answer and requested a hearing in this matter. 3.

Stipulations

- Respondents admit the jurisdictional allegations in the Complaint and neither admit nor deny the factual allegations in the Complaint.
- Respondents waive any right to contest the allegations in the Complaint and their 5. right to appeal this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO).

- 6. Respondents certify that they are complying fully with the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 and the regulations at 40 C.F.R. Part 745.
- 7. Respondents consent to the assessment of the civil penalty stated in this CAFO and to the terms of this CAFO.
- 8. The parties agree that settling this action without further litigation, upon the terms of this CAFO, is in the public interest.

Civil Penalties

- 9. In consideration of Respondents' attitude and other factors as justice may require, EPA agrees to mitigate the proposed penalty of \$10,810.00 to \$7,427.00.
- 10. Respondents must pay the civil penalty payment of \$7,427.00, with interest, in accordance with the following schedule: within 30 days after the effective date of this CAFO, Respondents must pay the first penalty payment of \$2,500.00; within five months after the effective date of this CAFO, Respondents must pay the second penalty payment of \$2,500.00; and within 9 months of the effective date of this CAFO, Respondents must pay the third penalty payment of \$2,500.00. Respondents shall make each civil penalty payment by sending a cashier's or certified check, payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America," to:

Each check must state "In the Matter of: David Cohen and Harry Cohen Company, Inc.," the docket number of this CAFO, and the billing document number.

11. A transmittal letter stating Respondents' name, complete address, the case docket number, and the billing document number must accompany each payment. Respondents must send a copy of each check and transmittal letter to:

- 12. This civil penalty is not deductible for federal tax purposes.
- 13. If Respondents do not pay the civil penalty timely, and upon notice to Respondents, the entire remaining balance of the civil penalty shall become due and owing no later than 30 days after missed payment date. If Respondents fail to pay the remaining civil penalty balance within 30 days after a missed payment date, EPA may refer this matter to the Attorney General who will recover such amount, plus interest, in the appropriate district court of the United States under Section 16(a) of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a). The validity, amount, and appropriateness of the civil penalty are not reviewable in a collection action.
- 14. Pursuant to 31 C.F.R. § 901.9, Respondents must pay the following on any amount overdue under this CAFO. Interest will accrue on any amount overdue from the date payment

was due at a rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury. Respondents must pay a \$15.00 handling charge each month that any portion of the penalty is more than 30 days past due. In addition, Respondents must pay a 6 percent per year penalty on any principal amount 90 days past due.

General Provisions

- 15. This CAFO resolves only Respondents' liability for federal civil penalties for the violations alleged in the Complaint.
- 16. This CAFO does not affect the right of EPA or the United States to pursue appropriate injunctive or other equitable relief or criminal sanctions for any violation of law.
- 17. This CAFO does not affect Respondents' responsibility to comply with the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 and other applicable federal, state, and local laws.
 - 18. The terms of this CAFO bind Respondents, and their successors and assigns.
- 19. Each person signing this agreement certifies that he or she has the authority to sign for the party whom he or she represents and to bind that party to its terms.
 - 20. Each party agrees to bear its own costs and attorney's fees in this action.
 - 21. This CAFO constitutes and entire agreement between the parties.
