Consent Agreement and Final Order

- 1. Complainant, the Director of the Air and Radiation Division, U.S. Environmental 5

 Protection Agency (U.S. EPA), Region 5, brought this administrative action seeking a civil penalty under Section 113(d) of the Clean Air Act (CAA or the Act), 42 U.S.C. § 7413(d).
- 2. On June 30, 2009, U.S. EPA filed the Complaint in this action against Respondent Sauder Woodworking Company (Sauder). The Complaint alleges that Respondent violated Sections 110, 111 and 502 of the Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 7411, 7412 and 7661a(a), the Ohio State Implementation Plan (SIP), 40 C.F.R. Part 60, Subparts A and Dc, Sauder's Permit to Install 03-05740 (PTI) and Sauder's Title V permit by exceeding opacity limitations at Boilers #1 (B008) and #2 (B009), exceeding nitrogen oxide (NO_x) emissions limitations at Boilers B008 and B009, failing to continuously monitor opacity and NO_x emissions at Boilers B008 and B009, failing to fulfill all reporting requirements required by 40 C.F.R. Subpart A, and exceeding volatile organic compound (VOC) emission limitations at Boiler B009 at its cogeneration facility in Archbold, Ohio.
- 3. On or about July 24, 2009, Respondent filed a Request for Hearing and Answer to Complainant's Complaint.

Stipulations

- 4. Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations in the Complaint and neither admits nor denies the factual allegations in the Complaint.
- 5. Respondent waives any right to contest the allegations in the Complaint and its right to appeal this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO).
- 6. Respondent certifies that it is complying fully with the Ohio SIP, 40 C.F.R. Part 63, Subparts A and Dc, its Title V permit and its Permit to Install.
- 7. Respondent consents to the assessment of the civil penalty specified in this CAFO and to the terms of this CAFO.
- 8. The parties agree that settling this action without further litigation, upon the terms in this CAFO, is in the public interest.

Civil Penalty

- 9. In consideration of the factors specified in Section 113(e) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(e), including the facts of this case, the nature of the alleged violations, the cooperation demonstrated by Respondent, and other relevant factors, Complainant agrees to mitigate the proposed penalty of \$328,334 to \$79,500.
- 10. Within 30 days after the effective date of this CAFO, Respondent must pay the\$79,500 civil penalty by one of the following options:
 - a. Sending via U.S. Postal Service mail a cashier's or certified check payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America," to:

- 12. This civil penalty is not deductible for federal tax purposes.
- 13. If Respondent does not pay timely the civil penalty, U.S. EPA may bring an action to collect any unpaid portion of the penalty with interest, handling charges, nonpayment penalties and the United States' enforcement expenses for the collection action under Section 113(d)(5) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(d)(5). The validity, amount, and appropriateness of the civil penalty are not reviewable in a collection action.
- 14. Pursuant to 31 C.F.R. § 901.9, Respondent must pay the following on any amount overdue under this CAFO. Interest will accrue on any overdue amount from the date payment was due at a rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury. Respondent must pay a \$15 handling charge each month that any portion of the penalty is more than 30 days past due. In addition, Respondent must pay a quarterly nonpayment penalty each quarter during which the assessed penalty is overdue according to Section 113(d)(5) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(d)(5). This nonpayment penalty will be 10 percent of the aggregate amount of the outstanding penalties and nonpayment penalties accrued from the beginning of the quarter.

General Provisions

15. This CAFO resolves only Respondent's liability for federal civil penalties for the

violations alleged in the Complaint.

16. This CAFO does not affect the right of U.S. EPA or the United States to pursue

appropriate injunctive or other equitable relief or criminal sanctions for any other violation of

law.

17. This CAFO does not affect Respondent's responsibility to comply with the Act and

other applicable federal, state, and local laws. Except as provided in paragraph 15, above,

compliance with this CAFO will not be a defense to any actions subsequently commenced

pursuant to federal laws administered by Complainant.

18. This CAFO constitutes an "enforcement response" as that term is used in U.S.

EPA's Clean Air Act Stationary Source Civil Penalty Policy to determine Respondent's "full

compliance history" under Section 113(e) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7413(e).

19. The terms of this CAFO bind Respondent, its successors, and assigns.

20. Each person signing this consent agreement certifies that he or she has the authority

to sign for the party whom he or she represents and to bind that party to its terms.

Each party agrees to bear its own cost and attorneys' fees in this action.

This CAFO constitutes the entire agreement between the parties.
