Dear President doney and Ms. Nicholson:

This letter is to inform you officially that the Hays/WhiteCowWater System has had violations of the National Primary Drinking Water Regulations (NPDWRs), and of the Administrative Order, issued October 9, 2008. The Administrative Order requires Prairie Mountain Utilities (the Utility) and the Ft. Belknap Indian Community (Tribe) to comply with various regulations issued by EPA under the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA), 42 U.S.C. section 300f, et seq.

1. The Administrative Order, page 4, item 1 states:

"Upon the effective date of this Order, Respondents shall comply with the total coliform maximum contaminant level (MCL). 40 CFR 141.63(a).

The Utility and EPA were notified by the lab on May 25 that a sample collected on May 19 in Hays/WhiteCow tested positive for total coliform bacteria. On May 26. Barbara Burkland called Scott Snow and Margaret Nicholson and reviewed the process for collecting repeat samples. Four repeat samples were collected on May 26. On May 29, the lab notified the Tribe and EPA that one of those four samples also was positive for total coliform bacteria. The regulations state that no more than one sample collected during the month may be positive for total coliform bacteria. These samples constitute an exceedance of the total coliform MCL for May, 2009. The system has therefore violated the regulations and the Administrative Order.

The Administrative Order, page 5, item 4 states:

Upon the effective date of this Order, Respondents shall report any total coliform MCL violations to EPA by the end of the next business day. 40 C.F.R. 141.21(g)(1).

The total coliform MCL violation has not been reported to EPA.

For this MCL exceedence episode, the following actions are required:

- Notify the EPA of the violation no later than the end of the next business day after learning of the violation. This notification has not occurred.
- Notify your customers of the MCL exceedence by publishing a public notice in the newspaper, or by direct delivery, within 30 days of your knowledge of each exceedence.
 - A copy of a public notice template is attached. Please provide this office with a copy of the notice and information about when and where the notice was posted, by close of business Monday, June 29, 2009
- You must include this violation in next year's 2009 Consumer Confidence Report.
- You are required to implement action to correct water system deficiencies which may have contributed to this contamination episode.
- You are required to collect five routine coliform samples for the month of June, 2009.

EPA is considering additional enforcement action as a result of the noncompliance with the Administrative Order. Violating an Administrative Order may lead to (1) a penalty of up to \$37,500 per day per violation of the Order, and/or (2) a court injunction, ordering compliance.
