Attached is a Clean Air Act (“CAA”) Section 112(r)(1) Expedited Settlement Agreement (“ESA”) that has been signed by both parties and is now being submitted to you for approval in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.18(b). Please note that, consistent with 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.13(b) and 22.18(b), this ESA both commences and concludes the matter referenced above.

The January 5, 2004 memorandum entitled “*Use of Expedited Settlements in Addressing Violations of the Clean Air Act Chemical Accident Prevention Provision, 40 C.F.R. Part 68*” as revised by the December 20, 2013, memorandum entitled “*Changes to Restrictions on the Use of Expedited Settlements in Addressing Violations of the Clean Air Act Chemical Accident Prevention Regulations*” approves the use of ESAs for certain easily correctable violations. The ESA requires compliance and payment of a \$9,600 penalty within 30 days of its filing.

Once the Final Order has been signed, I will file the fully executed ESA with the Regional Hearing Clerk, thereby resolving this matter. The parties’ consent to electronic service of the ESA, once filed) is included in the ESA. Both parties chose to use “wet” signatures, so I will be filing a PDF of the executed ESA and submitting the original signatures to Regional Hearing Clerk when I return to the office. This settlement does not have any public notice requirements.
