Dear Mayor Stepp:

This letter is an addendum to the Emergency Administrative Order (Order) issued on July 23, 2015, to the Town of LaBarge (Town), as owner and/or operator of the Town of LaBarge Public Water System (System), under section 1431 of the Safe Drinking Water Act (Act).

Paragraph 22 of the Order required the Town to submit a plan and schedule to the EPA for professional repair of the Town's water tanks. On August 13, 2015, Shay Smith, P.E., the Town Engineer, submitted that plan and schedule. This Addendum constitutes the EPA's written approval of the schedule for replacement of the small tank and permanent repair of the large tank, pursuant to paragraph 23 of the Order.

The Order is hereby amended to include the deadlines in the following table. Each of these deadlines is an enforceable part of the Order.

Table with 2 columns: Action, Completion Date. Rows include: Complete final design plans... (March 31, 2016), Advertise for construction... (March 31, 2016), Submit revised construction schedule... (April 16, 2016), Construction of new tank... (August 31, 2016), Submit quarterly progress reports... (Until notified by the EPA...)

Submit daily chlorine residual results in monthly reports to the EPA, due by the 10 <sup>th</sup> day of the end of the applicable month.	Until notified by the EPA that chlorine residual monitoring and reporting is no longer necessary
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
Pursuant to section 1431(b) of the Act, the EPA is authorized to seek penalties if these deadlines are not met. If the Town has a reasonable basis to believe it may be unable to meet any deadline in the schedule, it shall notify the EPA well in advance of the scheduled deadline to request an extension. The EPA may, in its discretion, consider granting an extension.

The EPA encourages the Town to contact any other governmental agency or agencies that may require approval of the plan and/or schedule prior to modifying the System.


