CAA Stationary Source Expedited Settlement Agreement Instructions

To resolve the alleged violations using this Expedited Settlement Agreement ("Agreement"), you must sign and return this Agreement, as presented, within 30 calendar days of receipt of the Agreement.

If you do not sign and return this Agreement, as presented, within 30 calendar days of the date of its receipt, the Agreement is withdrawn without prejudice to EPA's ability to file an enforcement action for the violations identified in the Form.

If you decide not to sign and return the Agreement, EPA may pursue an enforcement action to correct the violations and seek penalties of up to \$109,024 per day for each violation of the CAA.

Failure to return the Agreement within the approved time does not relieve you of the responsibility to comply fully with the regulations, including correction of the violations that have been identified in the Form.

If you choose to sign and return the Agreement, EPA will submit the Agreement for approval and ratification by the designated EPA officials. Upon ratification of the Agreement, EPA will send you a copy of the ratified Agreement and Final Order. Within 30 calendar days of your receipt of the copy of the ratified Agreement and Final Order, you must pay the penalty using one of four methods described below:

1. **Payment online using Pay.gov**: Pay online through the Department of the Treasury using credit or debit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express, & Discover), or checking account information. Navigate to <u>www.pay.gov</u>, enter **SFO 1.1** in the form search box on the top left side of the screen, complete SFO Form Number 1.1, and select payment type from the drop-down menu. Enter the docket number.
