Purchase, Set up, & Training associated with the Magnum Venus Patriot Chopper Gun System. In addition Controlled Spraying Training by an ACMA certified trainer.

Attached is a list of Purchases and Training cost (see spreadsheet).

As of this date November 16, 2009, we believe that the SEP has been fully implemented pursuant to the provisions of this CAFO.

We were fortunate enough not to experience any significant operational problems with either the equipment or the training. Testing took a little longer to complete due to scheduling conflicts with our operation or the consultant. But, we were able to successfully complete in September of 2009.

Lastly we were able to establish by use of the equipment and spraying techniques a reduction of styrene emissions as follows.

Styrene Testing Comparisons

Associate Position	Styrene Decline PPM as %
Gun Runner	47.569%
Lam Tech # 1	45.192%
Lam Tech # 2	53.719%

NOTE:

In my previous job I was involved in some testing of different type of chopper systems.

The results demonstrated above are consistent with our findings between our old system and the "FIT" system. The difference from our testing was 45.712% this is good validation for me.

We now trust that we have complied fully with our obligation to the CAFO / SEP and look forward to having this issue completed and resolved.
