COMPLAINANTS' RESPONSE TO RESPONDENTS' ATTORNEY'S MOTION TO WITHDRAW

NOW COMES Complainant, US EPA, by and through its counsel, Luis Oviedo, and in response to Respondents' Attorney's Motion to Withdraw as attorney of record, states as follows:

- 1. Counsel Dennis Kellogg has represented the Respondents in this case since at least March 21, 2007, with full knowledge that his clients might have an alleged limited English proficiency. CX-21, letter dated March 21, 2007. Nevertheless, Respondents and their counsel have been able to conduct in settlement discussions in this case despite any purported language barrier. Furthermore, Respondents are sufficiently proficient in the English language to conduct a real estate business in the United States. Notably, Mr. Kellogg's second attempt to cease his representation comes on the eve of the January 20, 2009 deadline for the submission of Respondents' prehearing exchange.
- 2. Significantly, Mr. Kellogg has previously temporarily ceased his representation of Respondents, only to result in the delay and protraction of the resolution of this case. CX-21,

letter dated November 8, 2007. Respondents have also previously invoked Alternative Dispute Resolution, with the sole effect of further delay in the resolution of this matter. CX-21, letter dated July 7, 2008.

3. A dispute amongst the various Respondents does not provide any legal or equitable basis for the withdrawal of counsel.

4. Respondents have not properly asserted any inability to pay, and refuse to complete the required inability to pay form that has been provided to them by Complainant numerous times.

5. Complainant has complied with the deadline for submission of its' prehearing exchange, and has expended significant resources and time in moving this case forward. Justice, professional responsibility and judicial economy in this case are all best served by the fulfillment of Mr. Kellogg's obligation to zealously and completely represent his clients.

WHEREFORFE, Complainant objects to Respondents' Motion.

Dear Sir or Madam,

I have been retained as the attorney for the above listed individuals. In reviewing the certified letter mailed to the Xiongs, I wanted to provide additional information and also ask for information.

First and foremost, the Xiongs under no circumstance knowingly violated 42 U.S.C. § 4852d, Section 1018. Accordingly in Smith v. Coldwell Banker Real Estate Services, the Connecticut District Court found that "Knowingly' as commonly used and interpreted means that defendant was aware of his or her conduct and that defendant did not perform it merely through ignorance, mistake or accident." 122 F.Supp2d 267, 273 (D.Conn. 2000). The Xiongs are aware of the requirement to disclose lead-based paint information to their tenants and have taken the necessary steps to inform their tenants.

Second, while enacted October 28, 1992, section 4852d did not become effective until four years later. According to Sweet v. Sheahan, the Second Circuit court found that Section 4852d did not become effective until December 6, 1996. 235 F3d 80, 94 (2nd Cir. 2000). The court found duty of disclosure does not begin until that date and prior dated alleged violations were without merit.

The Xiongs provide the disclosures required by Section 4852d. First, in accordance with 4852d(a)(1)(A), the Xiongs provide each lessee with a lead hazard information pamphlet, "Protect Your Family From Lead in Your Home" endorsed by the EPA and "Lead Safe Work Plan: Lead Poisoning Prevention Program" endorsed by the

Chicago Department of Public Health. Second, in accordance with 4852d(a)(1)(B), the Xiongs stipulate the requisite lead based paint disclosure language in the actual lease. The language provided is in accordance with 4852d(a)(3). Third, in accordance with 4852d(a)(1)(C), the Xiongs permit each lessee a 10-day period to conduct a risk assessment or inspection of the unit.

There is additional information that we request if available. First, what are the specifics of the cited claimed violations? Second, what evidence is there of the Xiongs knowingly violating 4852d? Third, what dates are being alleged of the claimed violations? Fourth, what, if any, other compliance is required of the Xiongs?

The Xiongs have been deeply upset by the allegations set forth in the EPA's letter. The Xiongs have done everything within their power and knowledge to ensure the safety and education of their tenants insofar as lead based paint safety is concerned. Also, the Xiongs have complied with the City of Chicago's requirements through lead-based abatement and educational matters. Accordingly, we would be willing to meet with the EPA in a short date to discuss possible resolution of this matter. To show our willingness to be reasonable, we could discuss a nominal financial resolution to buy peace. Please, do not hesitate to contact me as soon as possible so we can expedite resolution of this matter.
