Subject: Requested action to be taken regarding the products in the shipment
described below

By this memorandum, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 8, is informing the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection (CBP) of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security that the products in the import shipment described below (Shipment) should be **Denied Entry-Refused Delivery** into the United States pursuant to the authority of section 17(c) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), 7 U.S.C. § 136o(c), and the implementing regulations at 19 C.F.R. section 12.114. EPA inspected this shipment on August 28, 2026, and refused entry.

The following information pertains to the Shipment:

- The importer is Navajo Manufacturing Company, Navajo W2, 601 W. 50th Avenue, Denver, Colorado 80216.
- The exporter is Jiangyin Jiasui International Trade Co., Ltd., 100-1 Xingyuan Road, Industrial Concentration Zone Changjing Town Jiangyin City, Jiangsu, China 214411.
- The broker is PLG Customs Brokers, Inc., emily.kostelnik@pegasuslogistics.com.
- The arrival date was August 13, 2026.
- The entry number is PLG-00250068.
- The quantity according to the packing list was 2448 pieces.
- The port of entry is Denver, Colorado 3307.
- The country of origin is China.

Reason for refusal recommendation:

- **unregistered pesticide (7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A))**
- **no notice of arrival (NOA) (7 U.S.C. §136j(a)(2)(N))**

The Shipment was in violation of FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(A), 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A), which states that it is unlawful for any person to distribute or sell any pesticide that is not registered under section 3 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136a. The Shipment also failed to include an accurate notice of arrival, required by 19 C.F.R. § 12.112, in violation of FIFRA section 12(a)(2)(N), 7 U.S.C. §136j(a)(2)(N).

Law and Regulation

FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(A), 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A), states that it is unlawful for any person to distribute or sell any pesticide that is not registered under section 3 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136a.

Under FIFRA section 2(u), 7 U.S.C. § 136(u), a pesticide is any substance (or mixture of substances) intended for a pesticidal purpose, i.e., use for the purpose of preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating any pest or use as a plant regulator, defoliant, or desiccant.

Under section 2(t) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(t), a pest is any insect, rodent, nematode, fungus, weed, or any other form of terrestrial or aquatic plant or animal life or virus, bacteria, or other micro-organism (except those on or in living man or other living animals).

Section 2(p) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(p), defines “label” as “the written, printed, or graphic matter on, or attached to, the pesticide or device or any of its containers or wrappers” and defines “labeling” in part, as “all labels and all other written, printed, or graphic matter – (A) accompanying the pesticide or device at any time; or (B) to which reference is made on the label or in literature accompanying the pesticide....”

FIFRA section 12(a)(2)(N), 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(2)(N), provides that it is unlawful for a registrant, wholesaler, dealer, retailer, or other distributor to fail to file accurate reports required by the Act. As required by 19 C.F.R. § 12.112, a Notice of Arrival of Pesticides and Devices (NOA), EPA form 3540-1, and a copy of one product label must be submitted.

Facts and Violation

There were 2448 “Good to go Premier Toothbrush Covers” products in the Shipment, collectively “Toothbrush Covers”.

Each of the Toothbrush Covers’ labels included the following language:

- “99% resistant to bacteria”

- “Our antimicrobial self sanitizing technology uses Zinc, an essential trace element that is necessary in our daily diet.”
- “The surface becomes 99% bacteria free within 24 hours.”
- “Resistant to Bacteria”

The Packing List that accompanied the shipment included the following statements:

- “Good to go Premier Antimicrobial Toothbrush Caps 2pk”

Based on the facts above, the Toothbrush Covers have pesticidal intent and therefore are pesticides. The Toothbrush Covers are not registered with the EPA. This Shipment is therefore in violation of FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(A), 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(1)(A), which states that it is unlawful for any person to distribute or sell any pesticide that is not registered under section 3 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136a.

The Shipment was also in violation of FIFRA section 12(a)(2)(N), 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(2)(N), because a registrant, wholesaler, dealer, retailer, or other distributor failed to file accurate reports required by the Act. As required by 19 C.F.R. § 12.112, a Notice of Arrival of Pesticides and Devices (NOA), EPA form 3540-1, and a copy of one product label must be submitted.

Summary

The EPA recommends that this Shipment be refused admission pursuant to the authority of FIFRA § 17(c), 7 U.S.C. § 136o(c), and the implementing regulations at 19 C.F.R. § 12.114. If the importer does not export or dispose of this merchandise, CBP may elect to seize the products as a prohibited importation pursuant to their authorities as set out at 19 U.S.C. § 1595a(c)(2)(A).
