Dear Mayor Norgaard:

This letter is to inform you of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) decision to close the Findings of Violation and Order for Compliance, Docket No. CWA-08-2012-0020, issued to the City of Poplar on August 8, 2012. The EPA has determined that the City of Poplar has complied with the requirements of the Order and therefore we will close it at this time.

Please be aware that the City of Poplar is still required to comply with the Clean Water Act (Act) and its implementing regulations, specifically the NPDES permit requirements authorized pursuant to section 402 of the Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1342, and found at 40 C.F.R. § 122 et seq. Violations of the Act may result in a court-imposed injunction and/or penalties of up to \$37,500 per day of violation.
