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General Comment

I would like to ask how the PISC ever got to 12 years? I am a landowner within another CCS project area. When this all started, we were told by developers that they would have to monitor the site for 100 years. The EPA regulations have a default for 50 years. Yet this project is only proposed to be monitored for 12 years. The pilot project at ADM (first CO2 sequestration well in the entire U.S.) only began injection about 14 years ago. So there is no long-term data or experience to back up what will happen over time. Only models, which are not fact-just educated guesses.

The well materials failure at ADM would demand that all CCS projects be monitored for longer periods of time, not shorter.

This project has additional complications, like the J&L well, that only add more complexity and uncertainty. There is no valid reason to reduce the PISC from the default 50 years. Please do not issue this permit with this inappropriate PISC.
