Complainant, the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region 8, and Respondent, Roof Crafters of Colorado Ilc dba Colorado Western Construction (collectively the Parties), by their undersigned representatives, hereby consent and agree as follows:

I. AUTHORITY

- 1. This Consent Agreement is entered into by the EPA, by its duly delegated officials, and by Respondent for the purpose of simultaneously commencing and concluding this matter, as authorized by 40 C.F.R. § 22.13(b), and pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.18(b)(2) and (3).
- 2. The EPA has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to sections 16 and 409 of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), 15 U.S.C. §§ 2615, 2689, and the regulations promulgated under TSCA Subchapter IV, as set forth at 40 C.F.R. part 745.

II. STATUTORY AND REGULATORY BACKGROUND

- 3. As directed by section 402(c) of TSCA, the EPA promulgated the Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule, codified at 40 C.F.R. part 745, subpart E, with the purpose of protecting the public from lead-based paint hazards associated with renovation, repair, and painting activities.
- 4. The RRP Rule requires that individuals performing renovations for compensation in target housing are properly trained, renovators and firms that perform renovations are certified, and the work practice standards at 40 C.F.R. § 745.85 are followed during renovations.

- 5. "Target housing" means any housing constructed prior to 1978, except for housing for the elderly or persons with disabilities (unless any child who is less than six years of age resides or is expected to reside in such housing) or any zero-bedroom dwelling. 15 U.S.C. § 2681(17).
- 6. "Renovation" means the modification of any existing structure, or portion thereof, that results in the disturbance of painted surfaces, unless that activity is performed as part of an abatement as defined at 40 C.F.R. § 745.223. 40 C.F.R. § 745.83.
- 7. Failure to comply with any provision of the RRP Rule, 40 C.F.R. part 745, subpart E, constitutes a violation of section 409 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2689. Section 16 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2615, as modified by 40 C.F.R. part 19, authorizes the EPA to assess a civil penalty of up to \$39,873 for each violation of section 409.

III. RESPONDENT

- 8. Respondent is a company doing business in the State of Colorado.
- 9. Respondent is a "person" for purposes of sections 16 and 409 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. §§ 2615, 2689, and as defined at 40 C.F.R. § 745.83.
- 10. Respondent is a "firm" as defined by 40 C.F.R. § 745.83.

IV. STATEMENTS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 11. On September 10, 2018, the homeowner of a residential property located at 4593 North Decatur Street, Denver, Colorado 80211 (the Jobsite) contacted the EPA regarding work performed at the property.
- 12. Based on information available to the EPA, Respondent entered into a contract with the homeowner on May 24, 2017, to include roof replacement, window replacement, gutter replacement, and exterior painting work.
- 13. The residential property at 4593 North Decatur Street was constructed prior to 1978 and is "target housing" as the term is defined in 15 U.S.C. § 2681(17).
- 14. During the period between August 2017 and June 2018, Respondent and its subcontractors performed roof and gutter replacements, scraped paint from exterior surfaces, and replaced windows at the Jobsite.
- 15. Respondent performed a "renovation," as the term is defined in 40 C.F.R. § 745.83, at the Jobsite.
- 16. At the time of the renovation, the occupants of the 4593 North Decatur Street property included two children under the age of six.

- 17. On September 17, 2018, the Denver Department of Public Health and Environment (DDPHE) conducted an inspection of the Jobsite.
- 18. Testing initiated by DDPHE and performed in September 2018 found wipe samples of exterior surfaces and paint chips at the Jobsite contained lead-based paint.
- 19. On October 4, 2018, DDPHE issued a Notice of Violation and Order directing Respondent to clean up and remove all visible lead-based paint chips on the exterior of the property and to wet-clean the property's front porch floor.
- 20. Respondent arranged for a certified lead-abatement firm to perform the clean-up as directed by DDPHE.
- 21. On February 6, 2019, DDPHE issued a Final Clearance of Violations confirming the cleanup described in the October 4, 2018 DDPHE Notice was completed.

Count 1

- 22. The "initial certification" requirement at 40 C.F.R. § 745.89(a) provides that firms performing renovations on target housing are required to apply to the EPA for certification.
- 23. Respondent failed to obtain initial certification from the EPA prior to performing a renovation on target housing, as required by 40 C.F.R. § 745.89(a).
- 24. Respondent's failure to obtain initial certification constitutes a violation of 40 C.F.R. § 745.81(a)(2)(ii) and section 409 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2689.

Counts 2, 3, and 4

- 25. Firms performing renovations on target housing are required to retain and make available to EPA all records necessary to demonstrate compliance with the RRP Rule for a period of three years following completion of a renovation, pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 745.86(a).
- 26. Firms performing renovations on target housing must retain documentation that a certified renovator was assigned to the project, a certified renovator provided training on lead-safe work practices to workers performing the renovation, and a certified renovator performed or directed workers who performed all lead-safe work practices as required by 40 C.F.R. § 745.85(a), pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 745.86(b)(6).
- 27. Respondent failed to maintain the following records to demonstrate compliance with the RRP Rule for the 4593 N. Decatur Street renovation:
 - a. Documentation that a certified renovator was assigned to the project;
 - b. Documentation that a certified renovator provided training on lead-safe work practices to workers performing the renovation; and

- c. Documentation that a certified renovator performed or directed workers who performed all lead-safe work practices required by 40 C.F.R. § 745.85(a).
- 28. Respondent's failure to maintain each type of documentation described in subparagraphs 27.a-c constitutes separate violations of 40 C.F.R. § 745.86 and sections 15 and 409 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. §§ 2614, 2689.

V. SETTLEMENT

- 29. The Parties agree that settlement of this matter is in the public interest, and the Parties agree that execution of this Consent Agreement and issuance of a final order without further litigation and without adjudication of any issue of fact or law, is the most appropriate means of resolving this matter.
- 30. In determining the amount of any penalty to be assessed, the EPA considered the nature, circumstances, extent and gravity of the violations alleged and, with respect to Respondent, the ability to pay, the effect of the proposed penalty on the ability to continue to do business, any history of prior violations, the degree of culpability, and such other matters as justice may require, in accordance with section 16 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2615.
- 31. By signing this Consent Agreement, Respondent: (a) admits that Respondent was subject to the RRP requirements, 40 C.F.R. part 745, subpart E, at the time the work described herein was being conducted; (b) admits the jurisdictional allegations made herein; (c) neither admits nor denies the factual allegations contained herein; and (d) consents to the assessment of the penalty specified in this Consent Agreement.
- 32. Pursuant to section 16 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2615, the EPA has determined that a civil penalty of eight thousand two hundred seventy dollars (\$8,270) is appropriate to settle this matter.
- 33. Respondent consents and agrees to pay a civil penalty in the amount of eight thousand two hundred seventy dollars (\$8,270) in the manner described below.
 - a. Payment shall be made in three (3) monthly installments. The first installment is due no later than thirty (30) calendar days from the effective date of this Consent Agreement, pursuant to Paragraph 50. Each subsequent installment is due no later than the fourth (4th) day of each month, beginning the calendar month following payment of the first installment.
 - b. Interest shall be assessed at the U.S. Treasury's Current Value of Funds Rate. Including interest, the first and second monthly installments shall be in the amount of \$2,761.33. The third and final installment shall be in the amount of \$2,754.30.

- c. If at any time Respondent makes an early payment or payment in addition to the monthly installment above, Respondent shall request revised installment amounts from the EPA after making such a payment.
- 34. In the event Respondent fails to make any payment of a civil penalty when due, the EPA may, without notice or demand, declare the entire unpaid balance due and any accrued interest, penalties, or handling charges then unpaid immediately due and payable.
- 35. Payment shall be made by one of the following methods. The payment shall be made by remitting a check or making a wire transfer or online payment. The check or other payment shall designate the name and docket number of this case, be in the amount stated above, and be payable to "Treasurer, United States of America." The payment shall be sent as follows:

- 37. Respondent agrees that the penalty specified in this Consent Agreement and any interest paid shall not be deductible for purposes of local, state, or federal taxes.
- 38. If Respondent fails to timely pay any portion of the penalty assessed under this Agreement, EPA may:
 - a. Request the Attorney General to bring a civil action in an appropriate district court to recover: the amount assessed; interest at rates established pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 6621(a)(2); and the United States' enforcement expenses;
 - b. Refer the debt to a credit reporting agency or a collection agency, 40 C.F.R. §§ 13.13, 13.14, and 13.33;
 - c. Collect the debt by administrative offset (i.e., the withholding of money payable by the United States to, or held by the United States for, a person to satisfy the debt the person owes the Government), which includes, but is not limited to, referral to the Internal Revenue Service for offset against income tax refunds, 40 C.F.R. part 13, subparts C and H; and,
 - d. Suspend or revoke Respondents' licenses or other privileges or suspend or disqualify Respondents from doing business with EPA or engaging in programs EPA sponsors or funds, 40 C.F.R. § 13.17.

39. Nothing in this Consent Agreement shall be construed as a waiver by the EPA or any other federal entity of its authority to seek costs or any appropriate penalty associated with any collection action instituted as a result of Respondent's failure to perform pursuant to the terms of this Consent Agreement.

VI. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 40. The Parties agree to submit this Consent Agreement to the Regional Judicial Officer with a request that it be incorporated into a final order.
- 41. This Consent Agreement, upon incorporation into a final order, applies to and is binding upon the Parties, and Respondent's officers, directors, employees, agents, successors and assigns. Any change in ownership or corporate status of Respondent, including but not limited to any transfer of assets or real or personal property shall not alter Respondent's responsibilities under this Consent Agreement.
- 42. This Consent Agreement, upon incorporation into a final order and full satisfaction by both Parties, shall only resolve Respondent's liability for federal civil penalties for the violations and facts alleged in this Consent Agreement.
- 43. Respondent waives any and all available rights to judicial or administrative review or other remedies that Respondent may have, with respect to any issue of fact or law or any terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Agreement, including any right of judicial review under the Administrative Procedure Act, 5 U.S.C. §§ 701–706.
- 44. This Consent Agreement does not pertain to any matters other than those expressly specified herein. The EPA reserves, and this Consent Agreement is without prejudice to, all rights against Respondent with respect to all other matters including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. Claims based on a failure by Respondent to meet a requirement of this Consent Agreement, including any claims for costs which are caused by Respondent's failure to comply with this Agreement;
 - b. Claims based on criminal liability; and,
 - c. Claims based on any other violations of the Act or federal or state law.
- 45. Nothing in this Consent Agreement shall relieve Respondent of the duty to comply with TSCA and its implementing regulations.
- 46. Failure by Respondent to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Agreement shall constitute a breach of the Consent Agreement and may result in referral of the matter to the United States Department of Justice for enforcement of this Consent Agreement and for such other relief as may be appropriate.
- 47. Each party to this action shall bear its own costs and attorney fees, if any.

- 48. The Parties agree that this Consent Agreement may be signed in any number of counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original and, when taken together, constitute one agreement; the counterparts are binding on the parties individually as fully and completely as if the Parties had signed one single instrument, so that the rights and liabilities of the Parties will be unaffected by the failure of any of the undersigned to execute any or all of the counterparts; any signature page and any copy of a signed signature page may be detached from any counterpart and attached to any other counterpart of this Consent Agreement and any signature page may be transmitted electronically (e.g., a PDF file).
- 49. The undersigned representative of Respondent certifies that he/she is fully authorized to enter into the terms and conditions of the Consent Agreement and to bind Respondent to the terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement.
- 50. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.31(b), the effective date of this Consent Agreement is the date on which the Final Order is filed approving this Consent Agreement.
