Enclosed please find an executed copy of the Expedited Settlement Agreement (ESA) that resolves the Clean Air Act (CAA) matter (Docket No. CAA-04-2018-8004(b)) involving Sysco Charlotte, LLC. EXPEDITED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

CAA-04-2018-8004(b)

This ESA is issued to: Sysco Charlotte, LLC

4500 Corporate Drive, NW Concord, North Carolina 28027

for violating 40 CFR § 68.25, 40 CFR § 68.65, 40 CFR § 68.73, 40 CFR § 68.75, 40 CFR § 468.195, and Section 112(r)(7) of the Clean Air Act.

This Expedited Settlement Agreement (ESA) is being entered into by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Region 4, the Director of the Air, Pesticides and Toxics Management Division (Complainant), and by Sysco Charlotte, LLC (Respondent), pursuant to Section 113(d) of the Clean Air Act (the "Act"), 42 U.S.C. § 7413(d), and pursuant to 40 CFR § 22.13(b).

ALLEGED VIOLATIONS

Based on a compliance monitoring inspection conducted at the Respondent's facility located at 4500 Corporate Drive, NW in Concord, North Carolina on April 26, 2017, the EPA alleges that the Respondent violated the Act's Chemical Accident Prevention Program, when at the time of inspection, Respondent did not provide evidence that:

It analyzed and reported in the Risk Management Plan the worst-case release quantity for the greatest amount held in a single vessel, taking into account administrative controls that limit the maximum quantity as required by 40 CFR § 68.25(b)(1);

It documented that equipment complied with recognized and generally accepted good engineering practices as required by 40 CFR § 68.65(d)(2);

It trained each employee involved in maintaining the on-going integrity of process equipment in an overview of that process and its hazards and in the procedures applicable to the employee's job tasks to assure that the employee can perform the job tasks in a safe manner as required by 40 CFR § 68.73(c);

It established and implemented written procedures to manage changes (except for "replacements in kind") to process chemicals, technology, equipment, and procedures; and, changes to stationary sources that affect a covered process as required by 40 CFR § 68.75(a);

It updated its process safety information required by 40 CFR §68.65 when changes in information resulted from a management of change as required by 40 CFR § 68.75(d); and,

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It submitted a correction within one month of any change in the emergency contact information required under 40 CFR § 68.160(b)(6) as required by 40 CFR § 68.195(b).

SETTLEMENT

In consideration of Respondent's size, its full compliance history, its good faith efforts to comply, and other factors as justice may require, and upon consideration of the entire record the parties enter into the ESA in order to settle the violations cited above, for the total penalty amount of \$6,100.

This settlement is subject to the following terms and conditions: the Respondent by signing below admits the jurisdictional allegations contained herein, neither admits nor denies the specific factual allegations contained herein, and consents to the assessment of the penalty as stated above; Respondent waives its rights to a hearing afforded by Section 113(d)(2)(A) of the Act, 42 U.S.C § 7413(d)(2)(A), and to appeal this ESA or otherwise contest the allegations contained in this ESA; and each party to this action shall bear its own costs and fees, if any.

Respondent certifies, subject to civil and criminal penalties for making a false submission to the United States Government, that the Respondent has corrected the alleged violations listed in this ESA.

Within fifteen (15) days of receiving a copy of the fully executed ESA, Respondent shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$6,100. Respondent's payment shall be made by sending a cashier's check or certified check (payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America") in the amount of \$6,100, in payment of the full penalty amount to one of the following addresses or via wire transfer:

Respondent's full compliance with this ESA shall only resolve Respondent's liability for Federal civil penalties for the violations alleged in this ESA. The EPA does not waive any other enforcement action for any other violations of the Act or any other statute.
