EXPEDITED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

DOCKET NO: <u>CAA-04-2011-8004(b)</u>

This ESA is issued to:

Blue Bell Creameries, L.P. 423 North Norton Avenue Sylacauga, Alabama 35150

for violating 40 CFR § 68.65, 40 CFR § 68.67, 40 CFR § 68.69 and Section 112(r)(7) of the Clean Air Act.

This Expedited Settlement Agreement (ESA) is being entered into by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 4, the Director of the Air, Pesticides and Toxics Management Division (Complainant), and by Blue Bell Creameries, L.P. (Respondent), pursuant to Section 113(d) of the Clean Air Act (the "Act"), 42 U.S.C. § 7413(d), and pursuant to 40 CFR § 22.13(b).

ALLEGED VIOLATIONS

Based on a compliance monitoring inspection conducted at the Respondent's facility located at 423 North Norton Avenue, Sylacauga, Alabama, on February 9, 2010, EPA alleges that the Respondent violated the Act's Chemical Accident Prevention Program when at the time of inspection, Respondent did not provide evidence that:

As part of its safety information documentation, it has complied and maintained the following information pertaining to the equipment in the process as required by 40 CFR § 68.65(d)(1)(vi): design codes and standards employed;

It has updated and revalidated the process hazard analysis at least every five years as required by 40 CFR § 68.67(f); and

Its written operating procedures that address the following safety and health considerations: Properties of, and hazards presented by the chemicals used in the process as required by 40 CFR § 68.69(a)(3)(i)); Precautions necessary to prevent exposure, including engineering controls, administrative controls and personnel protective equipment as required by 40 CFR § 68.69(a)(3)(ii)); and Control measures to be taken if physical contact or airborne exposure occurs as required by 40 CFR § 68.69(a)(3)(iii)).

<u>SETTLEMENT</u>

In consideration of Respondent's size, its full compliance history, its good faith effort to comply, and other factors as justice may require, and upon consideration of the entire record the parties enter into the ESA in order to settle the violations cited above, for the total penalty amount of \$5.850.

This settlement is subject to the following terms and conditions: the Respondent by signing below admits the jurisdictional allegations contained herein, neither admits nor denies the specific factual allegations contained herein, and consents to the assessment of the penalty as stated above; respondent waives its rights to a hearing afforded by Section 113(d)(2)(A) of the Act, 42 U.S.C §7413(d)(2)(A), and to contest the allegations contained in this ESA; and each party to this action shall bear its own costs and fees, if any.

Respondent certifies, subject to civil and criminal penalties for making a false submission to the United States Government, that the Respondent has corrected the alleged violations listed in this ESA, and agrees to pay a civil penalty of \$5,850. Please note that payment should not be made until after respondent receives a copy of the fully executed ESA. Within fifteen (15) days after receiving a copy of the fully executed ESA, the Respondent shall send a cashier's check or certified check (payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America") in the amount of \$5,850, in payment of the full penalty amount to the following address:
