CONSENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

I. Nature of the Action

- 1. This is a civil penalty proceeding pursuant to Section 14(a) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a) (FIFRA), and pursuant to the Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits (Consolidated Rules), 40 C.F.R. Part 22. Complainant is the Director of the Air, Pesticides and Toxics Management Division, United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region 4 (EPA). Respondent is Water Services, Inc.
- 2. The authority to take action under Section 14(a) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a), is vested in the Administrator of the EPA. The Administrator of the EPA has delegated this authority under FIFRA to the Regional Administrator by EPA Delegation 5-14, dated May 11, 1994. The Regional Administrator, Region 4, has redelegated this authority to the Director, Air, Pesticides and Toxics Management Division, by the EPA Region 4 Delegation 5-14, dated September 7, 2005. Pursuant to that delegation, the Director of the Air, Pesticides and Toxics Management Division has the authority to commence an

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enforcement action as the Complainant in this matter, and has the authority to sign Consent Agreements memorializing settlements between the EPA and Respondent.

3. Complainant and Respondent have conferred for the purpose of settlement pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.18 and desire to resolve this matter and settle the allegations described herein without a formal hearing. Therefore, without the taking of any evidence or testimony, the making of any argument, or the adjudication of any issue in this matter, and in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.13(b), this Consent Agreement and Final Order (CAFO) will simultaneously commence and conclude this matter.

II. Preliminary Statements

4. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.5(c)(4) the following individual is authorized to receive service for the EPA in this proceeding:

- 5. Respondent is a company doing business in the State of Tennessee. Respondent's business is located at 856 Lovell Road, Knoxville, Tennessee 37932.
- 6. Respondent is a "person" as defined by Section 2(s) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(s), and as such is subject to FIFRA and the regulations promulgated thereunder.
- 7. Respondent is a "producer" defined by Section 2(w) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(w) and 40 C.F.R. § 167.3, as the person who manufactures, prepares, compounds, propagates or processes any pesticide.

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- 8. Respondent's establishment is registered with the EPA as a pesticide-producing establishment (EPA Establishment Number 1086-TN-1).
- 9. The term "establishment" is defined in Section 2(dd) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136(dd) and 40 C.F.R. § 1167.3, to mean any place where a pesticide or device or active ingredient used in producing a pesticide is produced, or held, for distribution or sale.
- 10. Pursuant to Section 7(c)(1) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136e(c)(1), and the regulations promulgated at 40 C.F.R. § 167.85, a producer(s) operating an establishment registered with the EPA is required to submit to the Administrator of the EPA an annual report that contains the following information: 1) name and address of establishment; and 2) amount of each pesticide product that was produced and sold or distributed during the past year, and the estimated amount to be produced in the current year.
- 11. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 167.85, a producer is required to submit the annual report on or before March 1 of each year.
- 12. Pursuant to Section 12(a)(2)(L) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136j(a)(2)(L), it is unlawful for any producer of pesticides to violate the provisions of Section 7 of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136e.

III. Specific Allegations

- 13. Based on the EPA's review of the tracking system for annual pesticide reports required pursuant to Section 7(c)(1) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136e(c)(1), it was determined that the Respondent did not submit the annual report for calendar year 2013, which was due on March 1, 2014. In addition, the EPA determined that the Respondent submitted the annual report for calendar year 2014 on April 20, 2015, approximately 48 days late.
- 14. The Respondent violated Section 7(c)(1) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136e(c)(1), and the regulations promulgated at 40 C.F.R. § 167.85, by failing to submit to the EPA, the

annual report for calendar year 2013, and submitting the annual report for calendar 2014 after the due date (March 1, 2015).

- 15. Section 14(a) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136*l*(a), in conjunction with the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, authorizes the assessment of a civil penalty.
- 16. Section 14(a)(4) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a)(4), requires the EPA to consider the appropriateness of the assessed penalty to the size of business of the Respondent, the effect on Respondent's ability to continue in business, and the gravity of the violation.
- 17. After consideration of the factors set forth in Section 14(a)(4) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a)(4), the EPA proposes to assess a total civil penalty of **ONE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$1,650)** against the Respondent for the above-described violations. Civil penalties under Section 14(a) of FIFRA, 7 U.S.C. § 136l(a), may be assessed by Administrative Order.

IV. Consent Agreement

- 18. For the purposes of this CAFO, Respondent admits the jurisdictional allegations set forth above and neither admits nor denies the factual allegations set forth above.
- 19. Respondent waives its right to a hearing on the allegations contained herein and its right to appeal the proposed Final Order accompanying the Consent Agreement.
- 20. Respondent consents to the assessment of the penalty proposed by the EPA and agrees to pay the civil penalty as set forth in this CAFO.
- 21. Respondent certifies that as of the date of its execution of this CAFO, it is in compliance with all relevant requirements of FIFRA.

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22. Compliance with this CAFO shall resolve the allegations of the violations contained herein. This CAFO shall not otherwise affect any liability of Respondent to the United States. Other than as expressed herein, neither the EPA nor Complainant waives any right to bring an enforcement action against Respondent for violation of any federal or state statute, regulation or permit, to initiate an action for imminent and substantial endangerment, or to pursue criminal enforcement.

23. Complainant and Respondent agree to settle this matter by their execution of this CAFO.
The parties agree that the settlement of this matter is in the public interest and that this
CAFO is consistent with the applicable requirements of FIFRA.

V. Final Order

24. Respondent is assessed a civil penalty of **ONE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$1,650)**, which shall be paid within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this CAFO.

25. Respondent shall remit the penalty by either a cashier's or certified check made payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America."

The check shall reference on its face the name of the Respondent and Docket Number of this CAFO.

26. Payment of the penalty shall be sent by one of the methods identified below:

27. At the time of payment, Respondent shall send a separate copy of the check and a written statement that the payment is being made in accordance with this CAFO, to the following persons at the following addresses:

- 28. For the purposes of state and federal income taxation, Respondent shall not be entitled, and agrees not to attempt, to claim a deduction for any civil penalty payment made pursuant to this CAFO. Any attempt by Respondent to deduct any such payments shall constitute a violation of this CAFO.
- 29. Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717, the EPA is entitled to assess interest and penalties on debts owed to the United States and a charge to cover the cost of processing and handling a delinquent claim. Interest will therefore begin to accrue on the civil penalty from the

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effective date of this CAFO, if the penalty is not paid by the date required. A charge will

also be assessed to cover the administrative costs, both direct and indirect, of overdue

debts. In addition, a late payment penalty charge shall be applied on any principal amount

not paid within ninety (90) days of the due date.

30. Complainant and Respondent shall bear their own costs and attorney fees in this matter.

31. This CAFO shall be binding upon the Respondent, its successors and assigns.

32. Each undersigned representative of the parties to this CAFO certifies that he or she is

fully authorized by the party represented to enter into this CAFO and hereby legally binds

that party to it.
