RRP Microbusiness Settlement Agreement

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") finds that Respondent, Daniel Sanborn, 7 Morgan Drive, Bow, New Hampshire 03309, failed to comply with the Renovation, Repair and Painting ("RRP") Rule, set forth at 40 C.F.R. Part 745, Subpart E, promulgated under Sections 402(c) and 406(b) of the Toxic Substances Control Act ("TSCA"), §§2682(c) and 2686(b), during a "renovation," as defined at Section 401(17) of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. §2681(17), and 40 C.F.R. §745.83, of "target housing," as defined at 40 C.F.R. §745.224, at 113 Elm Street, Penacook, New Hampshire.

EPA finds that Respondent was subject to the RRP Rule and failed to comply with:

1) Notification requirements by failing to provide the adult occupant of the rental unit with the EPA approved pamphlet as required by 40 C.F.R. §745.84(a)(2);

2) Certification requirements by failing to obtain initial firm certification as required by

40 CFR §745.89(a) pursuant to 40 C.F.R. §745.81(a)(2)(ii);

3) Notification requirements by failing to post warning signs defining the work area while the work was on-going as required by 40 C.F.R. §745.85(a)(1);

4) Work practice requirements by failing to cover the ground before beginning work as

required by 40 C.F.R. §745.85(a)(2)(ii)(C); and

5) Work practice requirements by failing to contain waste from renovation activities to prevent releases of contaminated waste as required by 40 C.F.R. §745.85(a)(4)(i).

Section 16(a) of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. §2615(a), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. §3701, and 40 C.F.R. Part 19, authorize assessment of a civil penalty of up to \$37,500 per day, per violation, for violations occurring on or after January 13, 2009.

For the purpose of this proceeding, Respondent admits it is subject to the RRP Rule and TSCA and that EPA has jurisdiction over Respondent. Respondent neither admits nor denies the specific factual allegations stated above, consents to the assessment of the penalty below, and waives any objections it may have to EPA's jurisdiction in this matter.

The parties enter into this RRP Settlement Agreement ("Agreement") in order to settle the civil violations alleged above. Pursuant to TSCA and the Consolidated Rules of Practice at 40 C.F.R. Part 22, based on the nature of the violations and other relevant factors, EPA has determined that an appropriate civil penalty to settle this action is in the amount of \$6,100.

Respondent certifies that he is unable to make a lump sum payment of the penalty within 30 days of the effective date of this Agreement without experiencing undue financial hardship. Therefore, based on Respondent's ability to pay, Respondent consents to the issuance of this Agreement and consents to the payment of such penalty in six monthly installments, including interest. EPA has determined that this payment plan is in the best interest of the United States. The payments shall be made as follows:

First payment due June 30, 2017: \$1,100; Second payment due July 30, 2017: \$1,010 (\$1000 principal plus \$10.00 interest); Third payment due August 30, 2017: \$1,010 (\$1000 principal plus \$10.00 interest); Fourth payment due September 30, 2017: \$1,010 (\$1000 principal plus \$10.00 interest); Fifth payment due October 30, 2017: \$1,010 (\$1000 principal plus \$10.00 interest); Sixth payment due November 30, 2017: \$1,010 (\$1000 principal plus \$10.00 interest).

If Respondent fails to make any payment by its due date, the full amount of \$6,100, plus interest from the effective date, shall be due immediately. Respondent shall pay interest on the late amount pursuant to 15 U.S.C. § 2615 and 31 U.S.C. § 3717, plus any late charges to cover the cost of processing and handling the delinquent claim. The interest on the late amount shall be calculated at the rate of the U.S. Treasury tax and loan rate, in accordance with 31 C.F.R.§901.9(b)(2).

Respondent agrees that the first payment shall be made by June 30, 2017, as set out above, and that the additional five payments shall be made in accordance with the above schedule. Respondent shall submit checks, with case name and docket number noted ("In the Matter of Daniel Sanborn Docket No. TSCA-01-2017-0021"), for the amounts specified above, payable to "Treasurer, United States of America," and mail the checks to: U.S. EPA, Fines and Penalties, Cincinnati Finance Center, P.O. Box 979077, St. Louis, MO 63197-9000.

Respondent shall also submit a copy of each check to: EPA Regional Hearing Clerk, U.S. EPA - Region 1 (New England), 5 Post Office Square, Suite 100 (ORA18-1), Boston, MA 02109-3912 and Andrea Simpson, Senior Enforcement Counsel, U.S. EPA - Region 1 (New England), 5 Post Office Square, Suite 100 (OES04-2), Boston, MA 02109-3912.

Pursuant to Section 16 of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. §2615, and 31 U.S.C. § 3717, EPA is entitled to assess interest and penalties on debts owed to the United States and a charge to cover the cost of processing and handling a delinquent claim. Respondent consents to the assessment of the penalty and waives its right to: (1) contest the findings of violation specified in this Agreement; (2) a judicial or administrative hearing or appeal on any issue of law or fact set forth herein; and (3) appeal the Final Order accompanying this Agreement.

Additionally, Respondent certifies, subject to civil and criminal penalties for making a false statement to the U. S. Government, that it has corrected all violations and is in full compliance with the RRP Rule.

APPROVED BY DANIEL SANBORN:

This Agreement settles EPA's civil penalty claims against Respondent for the violations specified above. EPA does not waive its right to take enforcement action against Respondent for any other past, present, or future violations of the RRP Rule, TSCA, or of any other federal statute or regulation.

Nothing in this agreement is intended to, nor shall be construed to operate in any way to resolve any criminal liability of Respondent, and nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to limit EPA's authority to undertake any action against Respondent in response to conditions that may present an imminent and substantial endangerment. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees, if any. Respondent specifically waives any right to recover costs pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act, 5 U.S.C. §504.

If Respondent does not sign and return this Agreement within twenty (20) days of the date of its receipt, this proposed settlement is withdrawn without prejudice to EPA's ability to file any other enforcement action for the violations identified herein.

This Agreement is binding on the parties signing below. Upon signature of the parties and approval by the Regional Judicial Officer, this Agreement shall be filed with the Regional Hearing Clerk. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. §22.31(b), this Agreement is effective upon filing with the Regional Hearing Clerk.
