

VIII. Source Surveillance

The State of Wyoming's source surveillance program is based on periodic, source oriented sampling and testing, general field investigation, and source emissions inventory updating.

A periodic updating of the source emissions inventory will allow comparisons of air quality data to emissions data. The status of control measures will give current information on achievement of ambient air quality standards by 1975. The successful application of emission standards is dependent upon a current inventory to determine compliance with standards.

Standards and requirements for specific sources are applied on a statewide basis with appropriate attainment schedules. General field investigations related to visible emissions and performance standards will be continued on regular field travel schedules.

As construction schedules are completed and correction programs become finalized, field staff will perform source testing and inspections to determine effectiveness of such changes.

There is no specific provision in the Wyoming Air Quality Act requiring recording and reporting of information on emissions from stationary sources by owners or operators.
