## NOTICE OF RENEWAL OF TITLE V PERMIT

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) is the air pollution control agency for all of Orange County and portions of Los Angeles, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. These are existing facilities applying for a Title V renewals. Veolia Energy Los Angeles, Inc., is in business of providing cooling and heated air conditioning to various office buildings, hotels, hospital and apartment buildings. The facility is operating boilers, non-emergency engines, emergency engines and other equipment that are exempt from permit requirement. LA Co. Metro. Trans. Authority is responsible for the continuous improvement of an efficient and effective transportation system for Los Angeles County and is engaged in the application of spray coatings to buses and operation of emergency internal combustion engines.

Pursuant to Title V of the federal Clean Air Act and SCAQMD Rule 3004(f), a Title V permit shall expire five years from the date of issuance unless such permit has been renewed.

Accordingly, Veolia Energy Los Angeles, Inc., and LA Co. Metro. Trans. Authority have each submitted a Title V renewal application and requested the SCAQMD to renew their Title V permits. The proposed permits incorporate

updates to the facilities' information, as provided in their respective Title V renewal applications, as well as updates to all rules and regulations that are currently applicable to the individual facilities.

The proposed permits are available for public review at the South Coast Air Quality Management District, 21865 Copley Drive, Diamond Bar, CA 91765, and at the Los Angeles Central Library, 630 West 5<sup>th</sup> Street, Los Angeles, CA 90071. Information regarding the facilities' owner's compliance history submitted to the SCAQMD pursuant to California Health & Safety Code, Section 42336, or otherwise known to the SCAQMD based on credible information, is also available from SCAQMD for public review.
