

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
**PROPOSED ISSUANCE OF TITLE V PERMIT**

Pursuant to the Shasta County Air Quality Management District (District) Rule 5, "Additional Procedures For Issuing Permits To Operate For Sources Subject To Title V Of The Federal Clean Air Act Amendments Of 1990", the Air Pollution Control Officer (APCO) is issuing a public notice regarding the preliminary decision to renew the Title V Operating Permit to Pacific Gas and Electric Company - Burney Compressor Station located on Compressor Station Road in Burney, California. This facility is not a major source of criteria pollutants but is subject to the Title V permitting program based on determination of the facility's potential to emit. This permitting action is a renewal of the current Title V Operating Permit for the facility and does not involve an emission change.

Written comments regarding the proposed decision may be submitted to the District within a period of thirty (30) days of the date of this notice. Any written comments received will be considered by the APCO prior to the final determination to issue the permit.

A public hearing to receive comment on this proposed decision has not been scheduled but one may be requested by submitting a written request to the District within thirty (30) days of the date of this notice. A written request for a public hearing must include the requester's name, mailing address, and a statement for the reasons for requesting a public hearing. Grounds for requesting a public hearing should be limited to issues relevant to District Rule 5. If a public hearing is to be held, the District will provide thirty (30) days notification prior to holding the requested public hearing.

The complete application, proposed permit, and evaluation report are available for inspection at the office of the Shasta County Air Quality Management District, 1855 Placer Street, Suite 101, Redding, California. The proposed permit and evaluation report sets forth the legal and factual basis of the permit conditions contained in the proposed permit. Written comments on the proposed decision or a request may be mailed or hand carried to the District at the above location. Additional information may be obtained by contacting Donal Jonio, Air Pollution Inspector, at (530) 225-5674.

After completion of this public notice comment period, the District will provide the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) with a 45-day review and objection period for this proposed decision. If the U.S. EPA Administrator does not object in writing, any person may petition the U.S. EPA Administrator to make such objection within sixty (60) days after the expiration of the U.S. EPA review period. Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period for this proposed decision, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period or that the grounds for such objection arose after such period. The APCO shall not issue the permit until the EPA's objection has been resolved.
