

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE REVISED TITLE V PERMIT “PERMITS-TO-CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE” ACCORDING TO AQMD RULES 212 AND 3006

This notice is to inform you that the South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) has received applications for permits to construct and operate at a location in your neighborhood. The AQMD is the air pollution control agency for the four county-region including all of Orange County and non-desert portions of Los Angeles, Riverside and San Bernardino counties. Anyone wishing to install or modify equipment that could release or control air pollution within this region must first obtain a permit from the AQMD. Rule 212 requires the applicant for certain projects to distribute a public notice prepared by the AQMD prior to the issuance of a permit. This notice is being issued because the maximum potential emissions for the project exceed the notification levels specified in Rule 212(g). Since this facility is an existing Title V Facility, Rule 3006 also requires publication of a public notice prior to the issuance of a revised Title V permit.

The AQMD has evaluated the permit applications for the following equipment and has determined that the equipment will meet the requirements of all applicable air quality Rules and Regulations.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Construction of seven new storage tanks, modification of two existing vapor recovery systems, and issuance of a Rule 1166 Plan (see table below for the equipment list).

This is an existing facility applying for a revision to their Title V permit. The facility operates a petroleum product storage and loading facility. This revision will add seven, new petroleum products storage tanks which are connected to two, existing vapor collection and disposal systems. The new tanks will store and transfer 92,100 barrels per day of petroleum products, such as gasoline, diesel, jet fuel, transmix, oxygenates, and blending stocks, to other facilities through pipeline or to tanker trucks through loading racks. Degassing and refilling emissions from these new tanks will be directed to two existing vapor collection and disposal systems (afterburners) for destruction. Additionally, a plan for excavation and management of contaminated soil will be issued.

The above listed equipment will be equipped with the Best Available Control Technology (BACT) for controlling air pollution. The maximum daily emissions increase from the project will not exceed 67 pounds of volatile organic compounds (VOC). The operation of the above listed equipment will also emit small quantities of some toxic compounds. The AQMD has evaluated the short term (acute) and long term (chronic) health impacts associated with the maximum potential emissions of toxic compounds from the equipment. Using worst case conditions, our

evaluation shows that the chronic and acute health risks are both below our rule's toxic thresholds (below a Hazard Index of 1). According to the state health experts, a hazard index of one or less means that the surrounding community including the most sensitive individuals such as very young children and the elderly will not experience any adverse health impacts due to these emissions. In addition, the long term cancer risk due to emissions from this equipment complies with the AQMD risk threshold.

The AQMD intends to issue a revised Title V permit to this facility which will include the permits to construct and/or operate for above listed equipment. As required by Title V of the federal Clean Air Act, the Title V permits include all of the emission limits, applicable requirements and operating conditions imposed on the equipment. The facilities are required to certify compliance with the Title V permits in addition to recordkeeping and mandatory reporting of any deviation from the permit conditions.

The proposed permits and air quality analysis are available for public review at the AQMD's headquarters in Diamond Bar, and at the Carson Public Library, 151 East Carson Street, Carson, CA 90745. A copy of the draft permit can also be viewed at www.aqmd.gov/webappl/PublicNotices/Search.aspx by entering the facility's ID number. Information regarding the facility owner's compliance history submitted to the AQMD pursuant to California Health & Safety Code Section 42337, or otherwise known to the AQMD, based on credible information, is also available from the AQMD for public review.
