NOTICE OF PROPOSED RENEWAL OF TITLE V PERMIT

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) is the air pollution control agency for the four county-region including all of Orange County and non-desert portions of Los Angeles, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. Rule 3006 requires that the AQMD publish this notice prior to the renewal of a Title V permit previously issued to the facility listed below:

This is an existing facility applying for a Title V permit renewal. This is a bulk terminal and fuel distribution facility. Products such as gasoline and diesel are stored in a series of storage tanks. The facility also operates gasoline and diesel racks which load petroleum products into tank trucks where the vapors are vented to a vapor recovery system.

Pursuant to Title V of the federal Clean Air Act and AQMD Rule 3004(f), a Title V permit shall expire five years from the date of issuance unless such a permit has been renewed. Accordingly, the above facility submitted a Title V permit renewal application and requested the AQMD to renew their Title V permit. The proposed permit incorporates updates to the facility information, as provided in the facility's Title V renewal application, as well as updates to all rules and regulations that are currently applicable to the facility.

As required by Title V of the federal Clean Air Act, the Title V permit includes all the emission limits, applicable requirements and operating conditions on the equipment. Title V facilities are required to certify compliance with the Title V permits in addition to recordkeeping and mandatory reporting of any deviation of the permit conditions.

The proposed permit is available for public review at AQMD, 21865 Copley Dr., Diamond Bar, CA 91765 and at the Placentia Library, 411 E. Chapman Ave, Placentia, CA 92870. The proposed permit can also be viewed at
