

I. PROPOSAL

E & J Gallo Winery is proposing a Title V minor permit modification to incorporate the recently issued ATCs N-1237-480-3 and '-601-0 into the Title V operating permit. The applicant proposes to install new diatomaceous earth receiving and storage operation with 6,000 cubic feet silo served by a bin vent filter system (ATC N-1237-601-1), and also to increase the daily throughput of diatomaceous earth receiving and storage operation (ATC N-1237-480-3).

The purpose of this evaluation is to identify all applicable requirements, determine if the facility will comply with the applicable requirements and to provide the legal and factual basis for the proposed revisions.

N-1237-601-1: DIATOMACEOUS EARTH RECEIVING AND STORAGE OPERATION WITH A 6,000 CUBIC FEET STORAGE SILO SERVED BY A BIN VENT FILTER SYSTEM

IV. SCOPE OF EPA AND PUBLIC REVIEW

This change to a Title V permit is considered to be a minor modification and, as such, requires no public review.

V. APPLICABLE REQUIREMENTS

District Rule 2520, Federally Mandated Operating Permits (Adopted June 21, 2001)

VI. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED MODIFICATIONS

E & J Gallo Winery is proposing to incorporate the recently issued Authorities to Construct N-1237-480-3 and '-601-0 into the Title V operating permit. These modifications involve installation of a new diatomaceous earth receiving and storage operation (ATC N-1237-601-1), and to increase the daily throughput of the diatomaceous earth receiving and storage operation (ATC N-1237-480-3).

N-1237-480-4:

Permit condition 1 was removed from the ATC N-1237-480-3, as the requirement has been satisfied with the submittal of Title V Minor Modification application included in Appendix D of this document.

Permit conditions 2 and 3 were removed from the ATC N-1237-480-3 as these conditions are listed on the facility-wide permit N-1237-0-2 (condition #22 & 41).

Permit condition 8 on the current Permit to Operate was replaced by permit condition 8 on the proposed Permit to Operate. This condition specifies the daily throughput limit for the permit.

N-1237-601-1:

Permit condition 1 was removed from the ATC N-1237-601-0, as the requirement has been satisfied with the submittal of Title V Minor Modification application included in Appendix D of this document.

ATC N-1237-601-0 is a new permit unit; therefore, there is no existing Title V PTO that it will be modifying. The ATC conditions will be carried over to the proposed PTO.

VII. COMPLIANCE

In accordance with Rule 2520, 3.20, these modifications:

1. Do not violate requirements of any applicable federally enforceable local or federal requirement;
2. Do not relax monitoring, reporting, or recordkeeping requirements in the permit and are not significant changes in existing monitoring permit terms or conditions;
3. Do not require or change a case-by-case determination of an emission limitation or other standard, or a source-specific determination for temporary sources of ambient impacts, or a visibility or increment analysis;
4. Do not seek to establish or change a permit term or condition for which there is no corresponding underlying applicable requirement and that the source has assumed to avoid an applicable requirement to which the source would otherwise be subject. Such terms and conditions include:
 - a. A federally enforceable emission cap assumed to avoid classification as a modification under any provisions of Title I of the Federal Clean Air Act; and
 - b. An alternative emissions limit approved pursuant to regulations promulgated under section 112(i)(5) of the Federal Clean Air Act; and
5. Are not Title I modifications as defined in District Rule 2520 or modifications as defined in section 111 or 112 of the Federal Clean Air Act; and
6. Do not seek to consolidate overlapping applicable requirements.

In accordance with Rule 2520, the application meets the procedural requirements of section 11.4 by including;

1. A description of the change, the emissions resulting from the change, and any new applicable requirements that will apply if the change occurs;
2. The source's suggested draft permit; and
3. Certification by a responsible official that the proposed modification meets the criteria for use of minor permit modification procedures and a request that such procedures be used.




