

Comments from Dr. Charles Werth, received 01.13.15

Page 13, line 21: Change "may seem to be difficult to achievable " to "may seem to be difficult to achieve".

Page 17, line 20: In this paragraph the report recommends that wastewater be recognized as having the "potential for multiple beneficial reuses, both as a source of water but also as a source of trace metals." Should wastewater as a source of energy also be mentioned?

Page 19, line 9: Change "examples details" to "example details".

Page 19, line 27: Here it is recommended that include an "approximate time line describing targets for transferring research products into actual practice within the agency.' While I think in theory this is a great idea, I'm concerned that timelines will be made a broken, and actually reduce stakeholder confidence. An alternative approach is to prioritize the order in which anticipated research products will be transferred into actual practice, and stakeholders will gain confidence as this occurs in a timely manner.

Page 22, line 15: Change "underestimate the difficult of developing " to "underestimate the difficulty of developing ".

Page 30, line 15: Put a period after "program areas".

Page 30, line 30: Replace the comma after "helpful" with a semicolon.

Page 39, line 1: At the end of this line, delete "for".

Page 39, line 5: After "plans", delete the period.

Page 40, line 11: Consider the following rewording: "... would benefit from developing q state-of-the-art information management system to provide the optimal...."

Page 40, line 32: Delete "is emphasized, ".

Page 40, line 45: Insert "be" before "brought".
