John,

I checked the last 3 years of annual reports for the 6 Phase I permittees. Collectively, 7 variances were granted. That represents 18 years of permits for new and redevelopment. That's less than 1 every two years for all of Seattle, Tacoma, and unincorporated Pierce, King, Snohomish, and Clark Counties. Ecology did not review the subject matter for these variances, so I can't tell you how many were variances from the flow control requirement.

Whether a vault would be a "severe and unexpected economic hardship" depends upon the specific situation and the local government's interpretation. Certainly, in cases where there are surface space limitations,, a vault can be the answer. Vaults are probably more frequently used in Seattle than elsewhere.

In the case of the JBLM permit, the flow control requirement would probably be met in most cases by infiltration facilities. Most, if not all of the military reservations have outwash soils that infiltrate rapidly. So, vaults with open bottoms or infiltration trenches/pipes would be used.
