Enclosed are three petitions dated July 15, 2008, July 19, 2008 and July 21, 2008 (received by the Environmental Appeals Board (the "Board") on July 17, 2008 and July 21, 2008), filed by Bill MacClarence, P.E., (OCS 08-01), Christopher Winter, Attorney, Crag Law Center (OCS 08-02), on behalf of the North Slope Borough, the Inupiat Community of the Arctic Slope, the Alaska Eskimo Whaling Commission, Peter Van Tuyn, Attorney, Bessenyey & Van Tuyn, L.L.C., Clayton Jernigan and Eric Jorgensen, Attorneys, Earthjustice, (OCS 08-03), on behalf of Alaska Wilderness League, Center for Biological Diversity, Natural Resources Defense Council, Northern Alaska Environmental Center, Pacific Environment, and Resisting Environmental Destruction On Indian Land), a project of the Indigenous Environmental Network (REDOIL), asking the Board to review a revised PSD determination by the Environmental Protection Agency, Region 10.

To assist the Board in deciding whether the matters raised by Petitioners should be reviewed, please have your staff prepare a response that addresses Petitioners' contentions and whether Petitioners have satisfied the requirements for obtaining review under 40 C.F.R. Section 124.19.

Response Seeking Summary Disposition. If you believe that the petitions in their entirety may be appropriate for summary disposition, either because the Board does not have jurisdiction to consider the petitions, the appeal is untimely, Petitioners lack standing to file an appeal, or none of the issues raised in the petitions were preserved for review, please file a response to that

effect by no later than August 6, 2008. Please include relevant portions of the administrative record with your response.

File an original (signed in blue ink) and five copies of these materials with the Board (at the address shown below) by the date specified above, and send a copy to Petitioners, with a certificate of service showing the date and method of service. Petitioners shall have 10 days from the date of service of a response seeking summary disposition to file a reply with the Board.¹

If the Board determines that summary disposition is appropriate, the Board will issue an order to that effect. If the Board determines that summary disposition is not appropriate, or that the issue of summary disposition should be reserved until after a response to the merits of the petitions are filed, the Board will issue an order directing that a response to the merits of the petitions be filed within 15 days of the Board's order.

Response not Seeking Summary Disposition. If you do not file a response seeking summary disposition, please file a response to the merits of the petitions by not later than August 21, 2008. Please include with your response relevant portions of the administrative record, together with a certified index of the entire administrative record.

File an original (signed in blue ink) and five copies of these materials with the Board, and send a copy to petitioners, with a certificate of service showing the date and method of service.

Mailing and Hand Delivery Instructions²

All documents that are sent through the U.S. Postal Service, Express Mail, hand-delivered, via courier must include the name of the organization, address, facsimile

¹The Environmental Appeals Board has an innovative system that allows parties to submit copies of documents, including exhibits, electronically in PDF. Instructions on registration and document submission, are available by using the "Electronic Submission" link on the Board's website.
