Dear Environmental Appeals Board,

Please review the EPA permit for Windfall Oil & gas for a Class II injection well located on Highland St ext. Brady Township. I believe that there is sufficient reasons why the permit should be denied, because it is proposed to be built in a residential neighborhood. It should also be appealed for factual error and the EAB should review a policy consideration.

Our residential area relies on private water wells, water that cannot be replaced.

The permit maps may be different than drawn and affects the location of gas wells on the maps.

The area of Review should be extended, because of concerned residents who provided a zone of endangering influence that as shown at the public hearing that assumed non-transmissive faults would change the zone, making it larger. The Carlson gas well should be included in that same formation as the injection zone area. The Carlson gas well emits fumes.

I believe that six gas wells in the same area as the injection zone, could be conduits for the toxic disposal fluids to flow into our private water wells.

I request this permit be denied because of the location of so many Oriskany wells (6 total) close or in the $\frac{1}{4}$ mile. These wells have been fractured into the $\frac{1}{4}$ mile area of Review.

The coal mines are located in the Review area, and had fracturing done. For this reason, the permit should be denied.

gas wells in this area may not be plugged.
Faults exist in our area. The information
on a fault block is inaccurate.

The confining layer of thickness varies
50 feet yet nothing in the permit
application shows this figure as accurate.

I request the permit be denied on
this basis.

Many residents are concerned and
request further study, that will deny the
permit. We residents need protection
in the form of insurance & a \$1 million+ bond.
We also ask the EAB to give us protection
and ensure water will be provided. No
one looks forward to getting water
from a water buffalo, parked in our
residential neighborhood and beyond.

This has happened to other people.
I feel this disposal injection well,
if not denied, may fail, due to concerns
like this from the industry, factual error,
operation mistakes. Faults, unplugged gas wells

Fractures, fluid migrating, EPA program needs improvement, property value, and health issues, living too close to a class II injection well.

For all of these reasons I ask the ENVIRONMENT Appeals Board to deny this permit.
