#### MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

The New England Region of the Environmental Protection Agency ("the Region") requests that the Environmental Appeals Board ("EAB") grant a forty-five day extension of time to file the Region's response to the Petition for Review jointly filed by the Connecticut River Watershed Council, Inc., and Jamison E. Colburn ("the Petitioners") in the above-captioned matter. The Region seeks this additional time because the parties have entered into settlement negotiations and may be able to resolve the issues raised by the petition through a permit modification.

On September 23, 2005, EPA reissued a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit, No. MA0000272 ("Permit"), to the Boston & Maine Corporation ("Company"). On October 27, 2005, the Petitioners timely filed a petition for review with the EAB contesting various aspects of the Permit and the process leading to its issuance. On November 2, 2005, the EAB directed the Region to submit a response by December 20, 2005 to address whether the Petitioners have satisfied the requirements for obtaining review under 40 C.F.R. § 124.19(a).

The Region and the Petitioners have begun settlement discussions with respect to

the issues raised in the petition. The Region's counsel believes that a forty-five day

extension will allow the parties adequate time to negotiate a settlement or, if the

negotiations are not fruitful, will allow the Region to provide an adequate response to the

petition without prejudice to Petitioners. The Region represents that its undersigned

counsel has discussed this motion with Petitioners' counsel and that Petitioners assent to

the motion.

For the reasons set forth above, the Region respectfully requests that the EAB

extend the deadline for the Region's response to the Petition to February 3, 2006.
