Dear Ms. Durr, Ms. Lepore, Ms. Menoyo, and Mr. Kahn:

On September 30, 2008, the New England Regional Office of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("the Region") reissued MA0039853 ("Permit") to the Town of Wayland Wastewater Management District Commission ("Commission"). The Permit authorizes discharges of treated effluent from the Commission's wastewater treatment plant ("WWTP") through its existing outfall into a wetland adjacent to the Sudbury River, or alternatively through a potential new

outfall directly into the Sudbury River. The Permit establishes effluent limitations, monitoring requirements and other conditions for these discharges.

In November 2008, Thomas Arnold filed initial and supplemental Petitions for Review contesting certain conditions of the Permit (Appeal No. 08-26). The U.S. Department of the Interior filed a Petition for Review dated November 14, 2008, also contesting certain conditions of the Permit (Appeal No. 08-27).

Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.19(d), the Region hereby withdraws the following provisions of the Permit:

Also pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.19(d), the Region plans to propose revised phosphorus permit conditions in a draft permit modification to be submitted for public notice in the near future. The rationale for these proposed conditions will be presented in a Statement of Basis that will accompany the draft permit modification.

Pending a determination of uncontested and severable conditions pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.16, the WWTP remains subject to all conditions, including phosphorus effluent limits, contained in its previous permit issued September 4, 1998.
