Independent studies should be considered

To the Editor

Both before and since the issuance of the permit to CMS's subsidiary, Beeland, to inject contaminant from Bay Harbor into a deep well in Alba, there have been knowledgeable objections by eminent professionals with valuable acquaintance with the extensively fractured and permeable understructure that CMS representatives and their supporters refer to as "several layers of impervious rock".

The comments of Dr. Jim McClurg, Emeritus Head of the Department of Geology and Geophysics, at the University of Wyoming, and a long-time property owner in Antrim County with extensive knowledge of the regional understructure, should be noted. He points to flaws in the study data, reasoning and, conclusions leading up to the issuance of the permit.

The especially cogent observations of Dr. Pa-

tricia Patterson, professional geophysicist with many years of experience with wells for gas, oil, disposal, brine injection and other uses right here in Antrim County should also be considered. She points out serious flaws in the study and report on which the EPA and MDEQ depend in seeking to justify their permit issuance.

These materials should be independently assessed and brought to the attention of the residents of the area. Caution and appropriate testing in the proposed injection plan is very important. It is, after all, the ordinary people of the state who are really in charge of things in our way of life, and not the few appointees living off their taxes.
