STATUS REPORT

The United States Environmental Protection Agency, New England Region ("Region"), with consent of counsel for the City of Leominster ("City"), respectfully submits to the Environmental Appeals Board ("Board") this Status Report with respect to the above-captioned matter.

On September 28, 2006, the Region reissued NPDES Permit, No. MA0100617 ("Permit"), to the City authorizing discharges from the Leominster Water Pollution Control Facility into the North Nashua River and establishing effluent limitations, monitoring requirements, and other conditions for such discharges. On November 3, 2006, the City filed a petition for review by the Board contesting the Permit's phosphorus limit of 0.2 mg/l from April 1 – October 31 and the phosphorus limit of 1.0 mg/l from November 1 – March 31. The Board received the petition on November 3, 2006, and directed the Region to respond to the petition no later than January 3, 2007.

On December 14, 2006, the City and the Region jointly moved to stay the proceedings until April 3, 2007, in order to engage in settlement negotiations. On December 15, 2006, the Board issued an order staying the proceedings until April 3, 2007. Due to continued negotiations over the issues on appeal, the parties subsequently

requested successive extensions of the stay until July 13, 2007. In its Fourth Stay Order, dated June 21, 2007, the Board granted extension of the stay until July 13, 2007, and provided that, in the event of a tentative resolution, counsel for the City would have until July 31, 2007, to obtain any approvals necessary to reach a final settlement. In a Status Report, dated July 31, 2007, the Region requested that the Board allow the parties until August 15, 2007, to report whether the parties have reached a final agreement. In its Fifth Stay Order, dated August 1, 2007, the Board granted the Region's request.

Counsel for the City has reported to the Region that the Leominster City Council has approved the settlement agreement and that counsel for the City intends to submit to the Board a motion to withdraw the petition for review.
