JOINT STATUS REPORT AND THIRD MOTION TO EXTEND THE STAY OF PROCEEDINGS

BACKGROUND

By order dated June 21, 2007, the U.S. EPA Environmental Appeals Board ("Board") stayed proceedings in the above-captioned matter until September 28, 2007, to allow the parties to explore the possibility of settlement. See Second Order Staying Proceedings and Order Scheduling Status Conference. By such date, U.S. EPA Region 1 ("Region") was directed to respond to the petitions for review of the permit filed by the Town of North Attleborough ("Town") and the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management ("RI-DEM").

On August 15, 2007, the parties participated in an EAB status conference to update the Board on the progress of settlement discussions. The Town and RI-DEM each concurred with the Region's assessment that the parties had reached an agreement in principle with respect to the nutrient issues on appeal, but that the agreement was contingent on RI-DEM withdrawing its challenge to the metals limits in the permit. See

Transcript of August 15, 2007, EAB Status Conference at 5-9, 12 and 16. Several weeks after the status conference, RI-DEM notified the Region and the Town that it would be prepared to drop its challenge to the metals limits in order to settle the outstanding petitions for review. RI-DEM cautioned that its offer depended on the limits for phosphorus and nitrogen being subject to a reasonable compliance schedule.¹

GROUNDS FOR CONTINUANCE OF STAY

In light of the progress made toward final settlement, the parties believe that the pending appeals can be satisfactorily resolved without further litigation. In accordance with the terms of the settlement agreement, EPA hereby notifies the Board that it intends to withdraw the contested phosphorus effluent limit pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.19(d) and to modify the permit to include a phosphorus limit of 0.1 mg/l. The modified permit will be subject to public notice and comment. Upon the effective date of the permit modification, or as soon as possible thereafter, the Town and RI-DEM agree to withdraw their petitions for review before the Board and join the Region in motioning the Board to dismiss the above-referenced appeals in their entirety.

In the interests of judicial economy and to conserve resources, the parties believe

The North Attleborough WWTF will not be able to immediately achieve the new effluent limitations for phosphorus and nitrogen. In this case, EPA cannot include a compliance schedule to meet the total nitrogen limit in the permit. Compliance schedules to meet water quality-based effluent limits may be included in permits only when the state's water quality standards clearly authorize such schedules. The total nitrogen limit is based on Rhode Island's water quality standards. Rhode Island's standards, in turn, do not allow for schedules in permits. While a schedule for phosphorus could be included in the permit, there are many overlapping issues related to the planning, design and construction of the necessary upgrades to meet the limits for phosphorus and nitrogen. In light of these overlapping issues and the fact that EPA cannot include a schedule for nitrogen in the permit itself, EPA intends to include a reasonable compliance schedule to meet both the phosphorus and nitrogen limits in a separate administrative order. Such a schedule will be developed in consultation with the Town and RI-DEM over the next 90 days and will be finalized prior to issuance of the final permit modification. The Town has already proposed a compliance schedule, which is under consideration by both the Region and RI-DEM and which appears promising. Accordingly, it is expected that this issue will be resolved expeditiously and to the satisfaction of all parties.

a continuance of the stay for 120 days is warranted to implement the settlement through a permit modification. The 120 day stay will allow sufficient time to accommodate the following steps necessary to enact the settlement: (1) negotiation of a mutually satisfactory administrative compliance schedule to meet the nutrient limits; (2) preparation of a draft permit and fact sheet in accordance with 40 C.F.R. §§ 124.6 and .8, respectively; (3) a 30 day public comment period, as required by 40 C.F.R. §§ 124.19(d) and .10(b); (4) consideration of comments, if any, submitted on the draft modification and preparation of a response; and (3) a 30 day period to ensure that no appeals of the modification are filed.²

RELIEF REQUESTED

Accordingly, the parties respectfully request that the Board continue the existing stay of proceedings in this matter for an additional 120 days.³ If at any time during the stay it appears that the prospects for settlement of this matter have materially diminished, the parties will promptly inform the Board of that fact and suggest an alternative course of action.

² The Region has no way to accurately predict whether the modification will be appealed by a party that is not subject to the settlement agreement. The Region does not expect an appeal from any party that commented on the draft permit, which included the two petitioners, a Massachusetts' state agency and Save the Bay (the latter commended EPA for including a nitrogen limit in the permit). The Region's response to an appeal, if any, will depend on the party involved and the nature of the appeal.

³ Petitioners, though their respective counsel, have informed the Region that they assent to this Joint Status Report and Third Motion to Extend the Stay of Proceedings and have authorized the Region to file it on its behalf.
