**REVISED STATUS REPORT**


The New England Region of the Environmental Protection Agency ("Region"), after consultation with the Connecticut River Watershed Council, Inc., and Jamison E. Colburn ("Petitioners"), hereby submits this revised status report to correct an error in its status report filed on August 3, 2006. The Region does not request any relief at this time.

In the Region's August 3, 2006 status report, the Region stated that "the Region's consultations with the Services concluded without objections from the Services to the Region's determinations under Section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act." The Region has recently discovered that, contrary to this statement, the Region's consultation with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service ("USFWS") has not yet formally concluded. Based on the Region's recent communications with USFWS staff, the Region fully expects that USFWS will shortly transmit a letter concurring in the Region's determinations and concluding consultations. The Region intends to issue the final permit modification on schedule before August 17, 2006.

The Region represents that its undersigned counsel has discussed this status report with Petitioners' counsel, that Petitioners concur in this status report, and that, notwithstanding the

circumstances described above, Petitioners intend to file, by August 17, 2006, a notice of voluntarily dismissal of the petition in its entirety.


