Dear Ms. Durr and Messrs. Taylor and Atkinson:

By letter to the Environmental Appeals Board dated October 21, 2005, William E. Taylor, Pierce Atwood LLP, on behalf of Wausau Papers of New Hampshire, Inc. ("Company"), filed, pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.19(a), a Petition for Review ("Petition") of NPDES permit NH0001562 ("Permit") reissued to the Company on September 20, 2005 by the New England Regional Office of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("Region"). The Permit superseded the permit issued by the Region on May 5, 1992.

The Company's Petition challenges eleven specific conditions of the Permit, summarized in the following table:

Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.16(a)(2)(ii), this letter notifies you of my determination that the eleven contested conditions described above are stayed during the pendency of this appeal. All other conditions of the Permit are uncontested and severable from the contested permit terms. Thus, all of the other conditions are not stayed and will become fully effective enforceable obligations effective thirty days from the date of this notice, as provided by 40 C.F.R. § 124.16(a)(2)(i).
