Dear Ms. Faggert:

This letter is to inform you that EPA Region I has modified Brayton Point Station's (BPS) National Pollutant Elimination Discharge System (NPDES) permit in accordance with the processes and procedures set forth at 40 CFR § 122.63 (Minor Modifications of Permits). Specifically, this minor modification corrects a typographical error (see 40 CFR § 122.63(a)) contained on page 14 of BPS's existing permit.


This office re-issued BPS's NPDES permit on October 6, 2003. On November 4, 2003, BPS filed a Petition for Review (the "Petition") appealing the new permit to EPA's Environmental Appeals Board (EAB). The Petition notes (see page 2) that the Region agreed, in response to comments made by the facility, to express the total iron limit in units of milligrams per liter (mg/l), rather than in units of pounds per day. The Region made the change in units for Outfall 004A, but inadvertently did not make the change for Outfall 004B. Therefore, the Final Permit continued to include iron limits at outfall 004B expressed in units of pounds per day. In its response to the petition for review, the Region acknowledged the inadvertent typographical error and indicated that it intended to fix the problem by processing a minor modification to the NPDES permit. See EPA Region 1 Response to Petition for Review (Dec. 23, 2003), p. 157.

The EAB granted review of the Petition on November 19, 2004, and decided the case on February 1, 2006, by issuing a Remand Order. On remand, the EAB directed the Region to amend the Final Permit to correct the typographical error regarding the expression of total iron limits (if the error had not yet been changed) via the minor permit modification process.

Therefore, the Region is now issuing a minor modification to your permit. The units for total iron found in the forth row of the table on page 14 (Part I.A.9.a) are changed from "pounds /day" to "mg/l." A replacement page, containing the corrected units, is enclosed with this letter. Please substitute this page in BPS's copy of the permit. A replacement page containing the corrected units has been placed with the original permit contained in the file at EPA Region I's Boston office.

9. During the period beginning on the date of discharge from any air pollution control equipment through expiration, the permittee is authorized to discharge from **outfall serial number 004B**: the combined treated waste stream of metal cleaning wastes and low volume waste streams. Effluent samples shall be taken after the last point of treatment.
- a. Such discharge shall be limited and monitored by the permittee as specified below:
