## INFORMATION ABOUT THE SECOND EXTENSION OF THIS REOPENED PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD:

On August 4, 2017 the comment period was reopened pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.14(b) to allow additional comment to address certain data, information, and arguments, that pertain to certain aspects of the permit that became pertinent since issuance of the draft permit in 2011 and the revised draft permit in 2014. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 124.14(c), the comment period for the Draft Permit was not reopened "across the board." It is, instead, only reopened with respect to certain issues. In conjunction with the August 2, 2017 public notice, EPA has prepared a document entitled, "Statement of Substantial New Questions for Public Comment" (the Statement). The Statement discusses the new data, information (including new regulations), and arguments, that appear to raise substantial new

questions and prompted EPA to reopen the comment period. The Statement also specifies particular records that are at issue. These records are included in EPA's administrative record for the Merrimack Station NPDES permit. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 124.10, the reopened public comment period for the Merrimack Station Draft Permit is hereby **extended an additional 14 days** from December 4, 2017 to December 18, 2017. All persons, including applicants, who want to submit comments on the issues that were identified in the reopened public notice on August 2, 2017, must raise all reasonably ascertainable issues and submit all reasonably available arguments and all supporting material for their arguments in full by **December 18, 2017**, to the address listed below.

In reaching a final decision on the Merrimack Station NPDES permit, the Regional Administrator will respond to all significant comments and make these responses available to the public at EPA's Boston office.

Following the close of the comment period and after a public hearing, if such hearing is held, the Regional Administrator will issue a final permit decision and forward a copy of the final decision to the applicant and each person who has submitted written comments or requested notice.
